PQ19830/25: To ask the Minister for Health the total number of BowelScreen invitations issued, by county, in 2024; the corresponding number of people, per county, who returned a completed faecal immunochemical test in 2024, in tabular form; and if she will make a statement on the matter.

Dear Deputy,

I refer to the above Parliamentary Question.

## **About BowelScreen**

BowelScreen offers free bowel screening to people aged 59 to 70 every two years. When the person gives us their consent to take part, we send them a faecal immunochemical test (or 'FIT kit') to do at home and return by post at their convenience. We invite people for screening within two years of us receiving their details, and re-invite them at two-year intervals thereafter.

Bowel screening is a preventative health measure. The main objective of BowelScreen is to reduce people's risk of developing bowel cancer, by detecting and removing pre-cancerous adenomas in the lining of the bowel. If bowel cancer is found early through screening, it's easier to treat and there's a better chance of recovery.

## Data on tests returned

After being invited, people can consent to take part, request a test kit and return it at a time that suits them. This means that people can be issued a test in one year and return it the following year. Programme data is published in our BowelScreen Programme reports. These reports capture tests issued in the reporting period, and the numbers returned. For the most recent published data please see <u>BowelScreen Programme Report 2022 – 2023</u>.

The figures in the table below show a breakdown of data from the programme report for 2022 – 2023 and show the number of invitations issued, per county, for each year, and tests returned.

<sup>\*</sup>In April 2022 we further expanded to offer endoscopy services in Mayo University Hospital. Aln October 2023 BowelScreen expanded the eligible age range to include people aged 59.

Validated data for 2024 is not yet available and will be published in our next programme report. We also publish activity and performance data, tracking participation and screening activity across our four screening programmes. This data is preliminary and may be updated in the future. We publish our data quarterly in arrears and the most recent data for BowelScreen for 2024 is available on our website.

## Our work to increase uptake

Our goal is for half of those we invite to complete the test. Our <u>BowelScreen Programme</u> <u>Report</u> for the years 2022 - 2023 shows that we had an uptake rate of 46.4%. This is similar to the uptake rate for the previous two years (2020 to 2021), and slightly below our programme target of 50%.

The uptake rate among people who previously completed a BowelScreen home screening test is 89.2%. We know that once people have done one test they are likely to return to screening, so encouraging first-time participation is a focus of our work.
