Dear Deputy McGreehan,

The Health Service Executive (HSE) has been requested to reply directly to you in the context of the above Parliamentary Question (PQ 21021/25) which you submitted to the Minister for Health for response.

Primary care psychology is a provider of psychological services at primary/community level in Ireland. The service grew out of hospital and community care models which are largely one-to-one assessment and intervention models. Today, it provides a range of services of varying intensity, encompassing education, prevention, early intervention and a range of treatments.

The number of patients seen is the number of unique patients seen in the month i.e. if an individual patient is seen one or more times in a month that is counted as one patient seen in the month. The table below outlines the number of adults and children seen by HSE Primary Care in 2020 to 2024.
