**To ask the Minister for Health if she will review and revise the medical card means-testing system to assess income after deduction of essential disability-related expenses, in order to more accurately reflect disposable income and improve fairness in eligibility decisions; and if she will make a statement on the matter. -Ruairí Ó Murchú**

Dear Deputy Ó Murchú,

The Health Service Executive has been requested to reply directly to you in the context of the above Parliamentary Question (Reference 21215/25), which you submitted to the Minister for Health for response.

Please be advised that Medical Card and GP Visit Card eligibility is based on a family unit assessment through the completion of a Medical Card and GP Visit Card application. As per National Assessment Guidelines a family is defined as an adult, their spouse or partner and any of their child dependents. In addition please note that Medical Card eligibility is primarily based on an assessment of means and is not granted on the basis of any particular condition, of itself, (except in limited cases: e.g. persons affected by drug Thalidomide; Symphysiotomy survivors etc.).

Moreover please note, in cases where a family is deemed over the financial threshold for a Medical Card and a Medical Report is included with an application the HSE still has discretion to forward such an application to a Medical Officer for discretionary review. As part of this review the Medical Officer will advise whether the medical circumstances indicated on an application will cause a family unnecessary financial hardship. The application will then be fully reviewed by a Deciding Officer.
