Dear Deputy Bacik,

The Health Service Executive has been requested to reply directly to you in the context of the above Parliamentary Question, which you submitted to the Minister for Health for response.

This response has been collated for the purposes of providing an update on Capital Projects only, the HSE are involved in multiple other procurements and contracts that may or may not have increased contract costs, these are not specifically covered by this response

As with all publicly funded bodies, the HSE adheres to strict National and EU public procurement procedures governed by EC Directive 2014/24/EU and the National Guidelines "Public Procurement Guidelines – Competitive Process" when undertaking any capital build works. In addition the HSE complies with the Department of Public Expenditure NDP Delivery and Reform Capital Works Management Framework (CWMF). This CWMF is an integrated set of contract forms, guidance and standards that are available for the delivery of capital build public works.

Under the Capital Works Management Framework the Contract figure is a not fixed price, provision is made in the contract for claims where there may be scope changes to the project, service delivery, legislative or socio-economic issues which may impact on the delivery timelines and the outturn cost of the project such as inflation, poor weather events etc.

Through robust internal Project Management and the appointment of our Design Team partners and Employers Representatives the HSE carries out mandatory and robust management of these contracts aligned with HSE Capital Projects Manual and Approvals Protocol to ensure the expenditure of the capital build programme is controlled.

Assuming that the Deputy's question refers only to final Capital projects accounts v's original works contract sums, HSE Capital & Estates do not hold this information centrally in the format indicated by the Deputy and would have to carry out a specific detailed exercise to obtain same.

However Capital & Estates do report quarterly to the Audit & Risk Committee of the Board of the HSE on works contracts greater than €10m (excl VAT) which have reached final account and have been approved by the Board since 2020. This information is shared in Appendix 1 enclosed with this response.
