#### Response

Dear Deputy Scanlon,

The Health Service Executive (HSE) has been requested to reply directly to you in the context of the above Parliamentary Question which you submitted to the Minister for Health for response.

The Health Service Executive (HSE) engages in public procurement for goods and services on an ongoing basis to support the delivery of health and social care services. It is accountable for effective and compliant procurement that delivers value for money with security of supply. The HSE, as the largest purchaser in the State, has a procurement spend of approximately €5.4 billion on goods and services on an annual basis.

Operating within a highly regulated environment, all HSE procurements are governed by complex EU and national legislation and seek to maintain the overall HSE goal of delivering effective and safe patient care. HSE Procurement manages competitive tender processes for a wide range of health-specific goods and services, including digital health, medical professional services, medical diagnostic equipment, medical surgical supplies, pharmaceuticals, and vaccines. HSE tenders are advertised on the Government Etenders Website <a href="https://www.etenders.gov.ie">www.etenders.gov.ie</a>. Registration on this website is free of charge and there are no costs associated with accessing HSE opportunities and documentation.
