Dear Deputy Murphy,

The Health Service Executive has been requested to reply directly to you in relation to the above parliamentary question, which you submitted to the Minister for Health for response. I have consulted with the National Clinical Advisor and Group Lead for Children and Young People (NCAGL C&YP) and the Gender Healthcare Programme on your question and have been informed that the following outlines the position.

The HSE has initiated a new Gender Healthcare Programme to develop an updated clinical model of care for gender healthcare services for the Irish population. Our goal is to develop a person-centred model of care and develop in an integrated gender healthcare service that meets the needs of people in Ireland.

The Gender Healthcare Programme team will develop an updated clinical model of care. This process will include engagement with healthcare professionals, people with lived experience and their families, and other stakeholders.

We are working with the HSE's National Health and Social Care Professions (HSCP) Office who will facilitate input from HSCPs, including pharmacy, psychology and occupational therapists.
