To date, all recruitment campaigns are oversubscribed and a number of recruitment panels are in now place. Where any existing vacancy or new post is approved for filling by the HSE, the National Recruitment Service works steadily on behalf of NAS to fill all such vacancies from those recruitment panels and if necessary, from new recruitment campaigns.

NAS are currently running an internal recruitment campaign for current operational staff to compete for a fully funded place on a Master's Programme in Specialist Paramedic Practice (Advanced) which is expected to lead to employment as a Specialist Paramedic (Advanced) with NAS. Candidates emerging from this recruitment campaign are expected to be available for this programme scheduled to commence in January 2026. Any further places beyond 2026 will be subject to approval from the HSE to fill either replacement or new Specialist Paramedic Paramedic Practice for the posts.
