Dear Deputy Clarke,

The Model of Care for Dual Diagnosis was launched in May 2023, this Model of Care recommends each specialist team has a WTE level of 13 team members, across many disciplines.

Dual Diagnosis specialist teams are tertiary level teams covering a catchment area of around 300,000 or more and they deliver interventions with other service providers in the mental health services, HSE drug services and other stake holders. With regards to monitoring and progress of services users, they are followed up as clinically indicated similar to other HSE services. The teams provide key performance indicators similar to other HSE Mental health services in addition to data being planned to be collected through the National Drug Treatment Reporting System (NDTRS) with the support of the Health Research Board (HRB).

Since its launch, the National Clinical Programme have been working on implementing this model, starting with four initial sites. Two adult specialist services and two enhanced Dual Diagnosis adolescent hub services. Please see the table below with more detail pertaining to these initial sites and the vacancies.

One of these services will be a team for adults in the Waterford region with 3 WTEs resourced in the NSP 2025, and the other is a new initiative, linked with the Cork Dual Diagnosis services, providing in-reach support to the Irish Prison Service.
