PQ9955/25: To ask the Minister for Health the number of notifications issued for Breastcheck appointments for each CHO area; the number of notifications on foot of such letter for the years 2019 to 2024, in tabular form; and if she will make a statement on the matter.

Dear Deputy,

I refer to the above Parliamentary Question.

## **About BreastCheck**

BreastCheck is Ireland's free breast screening programme. We screen women who have no symptoms of breast cancer so that we can find and treat breast cancer at the earliest possible stage. We aim to invite women for their first screening test by the age of 52 - in some cases it will be 53; and every two to three years after that, up to the age of 69. We provide access to appropriate care for those who need further tests and treatment. We work to make BreastCheck services accessible to all; for example, providing longer or group appointments, and information in braille and international languages.

We have four BreastCheck static screening units and 24 mobile clinics across the country. Mobile clinics enable us to provide breast screening for more women across the country. They typically stay at a location for between three months and two years and we invite eligible women living in the area for screening. The units then move to another location, where we invite eligible women in that area. We work to ensure that no unit is sitting idle for periods of time and that all women in Ireland have an equal and equitable opportunity to attend screening close to where they live.

## BreastCheck data

In the response below, for 'the number of notifications issued for Breastcheck appointments', we have provided the number of invitations we sent each year and for 'the number of notifications on foot of such letter', we have provided the number of women who attended for screening. Please note that a woman could be invited in one calendar year, but attend in the following or a subsequent year. As our invitations are issued for each static unit and its mobile units, we do not report data by CHO area.

We regularly publish BreastCheck Statistical Reports on our website. These reports show screening activity and performance for the year being reported, with detailed statistics, including the number of women who attended for screening in that year.

The table below contains the data requested, with links to published data that is available for the years 2019 to 2022.

## Being breast aware

BreastCheck is a screening service for women aged 50-69 who do not have symptoms of breast cancer. Women with concerns or symptoms concerning their breast health should not wait for or attend screening and should instead contact their GP who will give them the appropriate advice.

It is important that every woman is breast aware. This means knowing what is normal for her so that if any unusual change occurs, she will recognise it. If cancer is found early, treatment is more likely to be successful. It is therefore important for women to get into the habit of looking at and checking their breasts at least on a monthly basis.
