To ask the Minister for Health if combivent/pulmicort is covered under the GMS Scheme; if not, the reason for its removal; and if she will make a statement on the matter. -Brian Stanley

Dear Deputy Stanley,

The Health Service Executive has been requested to reply directly to you in the context of the above Parliamentary Question (Reference 26941/25), which you submitted to the Minister for Health for response.

Pulmicort[®] respules which are licensed in Ireland, are on the list of reimbursable items and reimbursed under Community Drug Schemes, including the GMS scheme.

Combivent[®] nebules are no longer on the list of reimbursable items since the Marketing Authorisation Holder requested to withdraw the product in 2017. Combivent[®] is no longer licensed with the Health Products Regulatory Authority in Ireland.

Ipramol[®] Steri-Nebs, which contain the same active ingredient as Combivent[®] nebules, are reimbursable under Community Drug Schemes and are on the published Reimbursement List. However, there is currently a reported shortage of this product as published on the HPRA website. The supplier has stated that this is as a result of unexpected increased global demand and a return date is indicated at the end of July 2025.

Where there is a shortage of a product from the Reimbursement List, the dispensing pharmacy can contact the PCRS to query reimbursement on the Community Drug Schemes. Currently Exempt Medicinal Products for Ipramol[®] are supported for the period of the shortage.
