PQ Question: To ask the Minister for Health to set out the average waiting time for a first appointment with a psychologist under HSE mental health services; and to detail how the 2026 funding aims to improve access. -

Dear Deputy Clarke,

The Health Service Executive has been requested to reply directly to you in the context of the above Parliamentary Question, which you submitted to the Minister for Health for response. I have examined the matter and the following outlines the position.

We don't collect waiting times by individual disciplines in Mental Health Services. Mental Health Team consist of range of multi-disciplines which services can access based on need when attending a service.

The CAMHS waiting list at the end of August is as follows

In General adult services offered 90% of new appointments within 12 weeks with the remainder seen shortly afterwards, for our POLL services 98% of new appointments were offered within 12 weeks.

The Recruitment of 300 WTEs as stated in the budget and creating specialist teams should, over 12–36 months, increase appointment capacity and therefore reduce waiting lists — but it will not instantly wipe out multi-year waits already in the system. Implementation, workforce recruitment timelines, and where staff are deployed determine how quickly local waiting times will fall.
