Re: PQ56519/25 - To ask the Minister for Health the total amount of funding allocated to breastfeeding promotion and support services in 2020 to 2025; the breakdown of funding by regional health authority; and if she will make a statement on the matter. - Sorca Clarke

Dear Deputy Clarke

I refer to the above Parliamentary Question which has been referred by the Minister for Health to the Health Service Executive for direct response.

The HSE provides breastfeeding supports within core maternity, paediatric and primary care services. Midwives and public health nurses support mothers and babies to establish and learn the skills of breastfeeding in the immediate and extended post-natal period. Frenotomy procedures are performed by appropriately trained healthcare professionals, where services are available.

The coordination of ongoing work streams and quality improvement initiatives within maternity, primary care and national campaigns is supported through the following core staff members working on a national basis through Child Health Public Health and in partnership with key colleagues including the National Women and Infants' Health Programme:

- National Breastfeeding Coordinator
- Assistant Director of Midwifery
- Assistant National breastfeeding coordinator (IBCLC)
- Child Health Communications Manager and Communications Officer
- Project officer.

The National Women and Infants' Health Programme have supported 19 maternity services to complete a 3 year self-assessment cycle from 2023 to 2025. During the three-year process, all 19 maternity hospitals and units evaluated their infant feeding services based on the National Standards for Infant Feeding in Maternity Services. This included interviews with mothers, staff and an organisational assessment over the 3 years. National actionable initiatives were progressed each year based on the results of the services self-assessment.

The HSE with the support of the Atlantic Philanthropy funded Nurture Infant Health & Wellbeing Programme funded the development of breastfeeding initiatives between 2017 to 2022. This includes the development of a new website mychild.ie, resources for new parents, new standards for antenatal education and infant feeding, nutrition e learning modules and a suite of breastfeeding training resources. These resources are now mainstreamed and ongoing implementation is funded through the HSE.



A national infant feeding education programme for health care providers was launched in July 2024. Over 430 midwives and nurses have completed the blended learning programme to date.

Throughout 2020 to 2025, the HSE's mychild.ie campaign has provided parents-to-be and parents of young children with trusted and relevant health information to make informed decisions about pregnancy and child health. The mychild.ie website and three free books (My Pregnancy book given in the antenatal period, Mychild0-2 and Mychild 2-5) which embed breastfeeding promotion and support services as part of the suite of information and advice on pregnancy, baby and toddler health. The mychild.ie website and books are supported by a multi-channel media campaign with advertising on TV, radio, out of home and online, as well as dedicated mychild.ie Facebook and Instagram communities. Costs include market research, creative development and media buying.

The breakdown of the allocation of non-pay funding for promotion and support services by the HSE are outlined in table 1 below. As national services and campaigns, these costs are not divisible by region.

The investment in additional infant feeding/lactation staff since 2000 and supports into maternity and community services has significant improved access to 1:1 breastfeeding support in maternity services when needed and to breastfeeding support groups in community services.
