RE: PQ 44778/25 - To ask the Minister for Health her plans to maintain the high quality specialist Endocrine service currently provided at Portiuncula University Hospital for women with pregnancies complicated by diabetes to Galway University Hospital as a satellite clinic.

Dear Deputy Daly,

The Health Service Executive has been requested to reply directly to you in the context of the above Parliamentary Question, which you submitted to the Minister for Health for response. I have examined the matter and the following outlines the position:

Women with pre-existing diabetes are included in the higher risk pregnancy cohort agreed between National Women's and Infants Health Programme (NWIHP) and the HSE West and North West Women's and Children's network for transfer to Galway University Hospital or another unit of the woman's choosing. The average number of pregnancies with pre-existing diabetes is less than 10 annually. A combined obstetric endocrine antenatal clinic will remain in Portiuncula University Hospital and will provide care to women who develop diabetes in pregnancy.

I hope this clarifies the matter.
