To ask the Minister for Health the number of people currently in receipt of the home support scheme in each county, in tabular form. -Conor D. McGuinness

The Home Support Service is funded by Government to deliver a volume of service each year as approved in the HSE National Service Plan. It is a non-statutory service and access to the current service is based on assessment of the person's needs by the HSE, having regard to the available resources and the competing demands for the service.

Demand for home support continues to increase due to population growth and the increasing dependency of the growing numbers of people aged ≥80 years, within the over 65 years' cohort. The home support service is managed by the local Home Support Management Team within each Health Region to ensure that this key service is available at the required times, in a flexible way and at the appropriate standard to support clients' assessed needs.

Home Support services for Older People are provided either by directly employed Healthcare Assistants (Home Support) staff or by voluntary and private providers who have formal service arrangements with the HSE to deliver the services. As at 31st July 2025, there were 4,788 directly employed Healthcare Assistants (Home Support) and a total of 59,671 service users currently in receipt of a home support service as of that date. Note that the HSE does not hold data on the number of home support workers employed by external agencies who have service arrangements to deliver services on its behalf.
