PQ49165/25: To ask the Minister for Health the screening target for the BowelScreen Programme, and the number of individuals who have received screening between the years 2020 to 2024 and to date in 2025, in tabular form; and if she will make a statement on the matter.

Dear Deputy,

I refer to the above Parliamentary Question. We regularly publish data on numbers screened in our <u>programme reports</u> and <u>activity and performance data</u>. Annual screening targets are published each year in the HSE's *National Service Plan*, which is available on *hse.ie*.

BowelScreen

BowelScreen offers free bowel screening to people aged 59 to 70 every two years. The primary objective of BowelScreen is to reduce people's risk of developing bowel cancer, by detecting and removing pre-cancerous adenomas in the lining of the bowel. If bowel cancer is found early through screening, it's easier to treat and there's a better chance of recovery.

The following table shows the number of people screened by BowelScreen from 2020 to 2024, and the first two quarters of 2025, and the screening target for each of those years.

In October 2023, we began offering BowelScreen to people aged 59 to 69, and this year, we have expanded the age range to people aged 59 to 70. As the age range expands, target screening numbers increase.

Our work to increase uptake

Our goal is for half of those we invite to participate in BowelScreen to complete the test. Our <u>BowelScreen Programme Report</u> for the years 2022-2023 shows that we had an uptake rate of 46.4%. This is similar to the uptake rate for the previous two years (2020 to 2021), and slightly below our programme target of 50%.

The uptake rate among people who previously completed a BowelScreen home screening test is 89.2%. We know that once people have done one test they are likely to return to screening, so encouraging first-time participation is a focus of our work.
