		Independent living means an individual can live	
		with the freedom and control to have the	
		same choices in life that everyone else has in	
		terms of housing, transportation, education	
		and employment. PAS is a tool for Independent	
		Living that allows disabled people to live	
		independently, providing individuals with the	
		freedom and flexibility they need to live their	
		lives as they choose.	
		With PAS, disabled people are in control and	
		direct the Personal Assistant (PA) to carry	
		out tasks both inside and outside of the home,	
		including personal care, domestic duties,	
		assisting in day-to-day tasks such as shopping,	
		support in the workplace or socialising.	
		PAs should not be confused with 'Home Help'	
		or Carers as they do not 'look after' or	
		'care for' a disabled person.	
		In Ireland there is no standardised procedure for	
		administrating personal PA hours. In	
		2017, 84% of those in receipt of PAS received	
		less than three hours a day and 42% of	
		these people were in receipt of between 1 and 5	
		hours a week, an average of 42 minutes	
		a day, despite disability being a 24-hour issue. As

	Freehill	an average need for 10 hours of PAS per person

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requirements and it would certainly not	
enable full active participation in the community.	
30 years on and the Independent Living	
Movement in Ireland continues to strive for full	
independent living on behalf of disabled people;	
advocating for choice and control over	
their lives and full participation in society as	
equal citizens. A right to PAS for disabled	
people is fundamental to achieving that vision,	
however, currently there is no such right	
in Ireland.

Dáil Eireann on the 19th November. This forum
