HSE Service Executive Updates were circulated and noted by Members which included:

# 3. Presentation on Understanding Screening – National Screening Service presented by Ms Fiona Murphy, Chief Executive and Dr. Caroline Mason-Mohan

Paraic introduced Fiona Murphy and Dr Caroline Mason-Mohan to the Forum Members. Caroline spoke about the different screening programmes, Diabetic Retina Screening, Cervical Check, Bowel Screen and Breast Check, and how screening is for healthy people and if you have a symptom it is important to consult with your doctor.

Caroline spoke about the criteria for population screening and the balance with screening. How screening may cause harm ie false negatives/false positives. Over-investigation and complications

of tests/ over-treatment and complications of treatments/psychological distress and anxiety/discomfort and side-effects. Population screening, assessing risk in individuals and referring those with a higher than normal risk for assessment. Those who are caught and are deemed to be positive and to see if they have a condition that needs treatment, a lot of people won't need treatments.

Described screening like a sieve, assess risk using a test, however screening is not diagnostic and is not 100% accurate. There are 4 outcomes for the individual: True Positive, False Positive, False Negative and True Negative. Caroline spoke about the benefits and limitations of the HPV screening, however is can be a very effective way of helping improve the health of a population. Screening needs to be delivered as a managed programme, providing everyone from invitations to follow-up after interventions

Fiona spoke about Interval Cancers, cancers which are diagnosed after the initial screen but before the next screening invitation is due.

National Screening Service's (NSS) Breast Check, Cervical Check, Bowel Screen and Diabetic Retina Screen were paused in March 2020. Huge number of staff were redeployed but most have returned from redeployment and all programmes have restarted.

Fiona also stressed the importance of being aware and acting upon any symptoms, even between screening appointments. NSS working on building trust, involvement of stakeholders and performance, staff development and training.

Fiona thanked the forum for the opportunity to present and asked for the members to make the information available to the public so they can be more involved.

The presentation was followed by Q&A and all questions were answered accordingly. Paraic thanked Fiona and Caroline for their comprehensive presentation and agreed we would send the presentation to the forum members.

#### 4. Motions:

Motions submitted by Cllr Peggy O'Dwyer, Cllr Hazel Smyth, and Cllr Vincent Jackson will be carried over to the next meeting.

Motions submitted by Cllr Peter Hamilton, Cllr Charlie O'Connor, Cllr Mark Leigh were discussed.

- Cllr Paul Ross motion was discussed, he requested more information. Joseph Ruane advised we would ask Mairead Lyons, Head of Disabilities to contact Cllr Ross regarding motion.
- Cllr Vanessa Liston is still waiting on a response for her motion and explained the basis for her motion. Anne O'Shea acknowledged it is really complex in terms of the distribution to GPs, they are private businesses and while the HSE has a contract with the GP in terms of the roll out of the vaccination, we are involved at our level but we have attempted to get some sense of the strategy.
- Cllr Márie Devine expressed her disappointment with the MCH response. They advised her the report would available soon. She requested we write to the MCH and ask for them to forward the report. Máire also requested a presentation for a future date
