228/22/09 Chairperson/Cathaoirleach

Councillor Catherine Connolly, outgoing Vice-Chairperson of the Forum, opened the Meeting and welcomed all new members and existing members of the Forum to the first Meeting of the re-configured Regional Health Forum West.

She stated that she was chairing the Meeting due to the fact that the outgoing Chairperson, Councillor Tómas Mannion, although re-elected through Galway County Council, was not re-elected to the Regional Health Forum.

She welcomed all newly elected members to the first Annual Meeting of the new Regional Health Forum and wished them well for the future.

She paid tribute to the outgoing members of the Forum, both those re-elected and not re-elected, for their commitment and co-operation with the functioning of the outgoing Regional Health Forum. She paid tribute to the outgoing Chairperson, Councillor Tómas Mannion, for his efficient and fair operation of the role of Chairperson of the Forum. She thanked members of the press and local radio for their coverage of the workings of the Forum. She then went on to say that she felt that outgoing Regional Health Forum had worked reasonably well, taking on board the fact that its mission was mainly in relation to representation. She was concerned regarding the lack of feedback from HSE Management in relation to Motions unanimously passed by the Forum. She was also concerned regarding the development of the health services particularly in relation to the lack of investment in public health services, the continuation of privatisation of the services and the reduction in funding in the current budgets. She thanked the Executive, Dr. Conroy, Director and his staff for their support with the workings of the Forum. She wished the new Regional Health Forum well in its endeavours.

229/22/09 Election of Chairperson/Toghachán an Chathaoirligh

Councillor Padraig Conneely was proposed by Councillor Richard Butler and seconded by Councillor Joe Cooney. As there were no other nominations, Councillor Conneely was deemed elected and took over the Chair.

Councillor Conneely thanked Councillor Connolly for chairing the meeting and also paid tribute to Councillor Tómas Mannion, outgoing Chairperson of the Regional Health Forum. He also wished to compliment and thank the outgoing members of the Regional Health Forum, both elected and not reelected for their contributions to the working of the Regional Health Forum. Re: Revised Break Even Plan

Dear Ms. Kane,

Please find attached the plan required to effect breakeven within Galway University Hospitals. €1.6 m of our plan is dependent on the Network facilitating the more efficient use of common services/resources within the Network Hospitals. I see this as the sole responsibility of the Network as the original allocation by the Network penalised GUH due to the size of its budget, rather than the service provided to its catchment area as a secondary and tertiary referral hospital.

In the budget plan submitted on the 29/04/09, I outlined Scenarios 1 & 2 Savings Plans. Scenario 1 identified proposed measures to achieve a shortfall in our budget and minimise impact on patient care. These measures included building on the control measures put in place in 2008 and the reconfiguration of services across two sites resulting in €8.489m savings. I indicated then that Scenario 2 which required a further €6m saving would seriously impact on all frontline services including cancer services.

The percentage change in budget from 2007 to 2009 was 5.7% for the network. This recognised the shortfall in funding within the Network as comparable hospitals to GUH around the country had an increase of 4.3% over this period, however GUH's increase for this period was 2.3%. In monetary terms this would have equated to €6m in

Network terms and €4m in comparable hospital terms. GUH is the tertiary referral hospital for the Network and the designated Cancer Centre and consequently should not be treated adversely.

Furthermore, the adjustments now required to GUH's budget, WTE's and services do not take cognisance of the corrections necessary for specific developments in cancer services and staffing adjustments within GUH which were agreed at national and local level.

As discussed at our meeting with Ms. Ann Doherty and Mr. Liam Woods, we identified the posts which were put in place in good faith following agreement with the Network Manager. These included 25 posts which were cost neutral through abolition of Nursing and HCA overtime to facilitate the introduction of the 37.5 hour week, the conversion of 33 agency posts as part of our 2008 Savings Plan which impacted on 2009 WTE figures.

Currently GUH provide a number of services which would be more appropriately provided in PCCC. These services include orthodontics service, continuing care unit, teen parenting programme and orthotics and are within our budget and WTE ceiling. We have not been successful to date in transferring these services on a cost neutral basis.

The closures outlined will result in the inefficient use of resources allocated to the hospital in particular in surgical services, radiotherapy, laboratory, radiology and oncology. These closures are to frontline services and impact on direct patient care and I must question why no effort has been made locally or regionally to address the central services of HR, Finance and Corporate Affairs which are duplicated across the region in the old Health Boards, Galway and Manorhamilton. Furthermore efficiencies across the combined PCCC and NHO for HR, Finance, Materials and Administration have not been tackled and such changes would not impinge on direct patient care.

The resultant effect of these changes has adversely reflected on the reputation of these Hospitals and its Management.

As General Manager of GUH, I wish to place on record my very serious concerns about the risk management issues for patients and staff, which will result from the implementation of this further €6m savings plan.

I request you to bring this matter to the attention of Prof. Tom Keane Director, NCCP without delay because of the devastating impact on our ability to deliver cancer services in accordance with NCCP.

Dear Deputy Burke,

Your representations dated 12th June, 2009, addressed to the Chief Executive Officer, Health Service Executive, have been referred to me for attention. The following outlines the position.

Galway University Hospitals have planned a range of measures to manage services within their budget for this year of €262 million. The hospital's actual expenditure in 2008 was €288 million. All hospitals, nationally, have a reduced allocation this year.

The savings measures cover the range of premium payments, overtime, allowances, holiday service schedules, administration, travel, training, maintenance, equipment replacement, etc and have been designed to minimise any direct impact on services to patients. However, it will also be necessary to introduce some bed closures and staff reductions.

34 beds in Merlin Park University Hospital have been closed. This has been offset by the opening of the new 13-bed Medical Assessment Unit at University Hospital Galway, which will allow rapid diagnosis and treatment of emergency patients, reducing the need for them to wait in the Emergency Department for assessment. This Unit opened in June, 2009.

These measures are essential to managing the financial challenges this year. They have been designed to allow the hospitals to continue to deliver the services planned for 2009 within the funding available and maintaining service quality and patient safety.

I think you are referring to a budget proposal from Management at Galway University Hospitals, which has not been accepted by the HSE. We are continuing to work with the hospital to ensure that any savings measures necessary have minimal impact on the level of patient services.

"To ask what is the current status of the Government proposal to transfer the Breast Cancer Service from Sligo General Hospital to University Hospital Galway and to ask if the proposed transition team has been established, and to ask who are the members of the transition team, and further, taking into consideration the devastating impact that current cut backs will have on the ability of University Hospital Galway to deliver cancer services in accordance with the National Cancer Control Programme, can Professor Keane and the HSE given a written guarantee that any existing resources and services which are currently available to breast cancer patients in Sligo General Hospital would at a minimum be available at UHG and that no patient would be disadvantaged in terms of the transfer of breast cancer services from Sligo to Galway."

HSE Reply:

Only a part of the Cancer services are transferring to University Hospital Galway. Medical oncology services will continue to be provided at Sligo General Hospital. Patients will continue to have their chemotherapy and outpatient radiation oncology appointments at SGH. Current arrangements to provide supportive or palliative care will remain unchanged.

Arrangements are now being put in place at the Symptomatic Breast Unit in University Hospital Galway to accommodate new symptomatic breast referrals shortly. General Practitioners will be notified in advance of the date from which Sligo General Hospital will no longer accept new symptomatic breast referrals. Detailed information about the Galway service and information, including application form, in relation to the Travel2Care scheme administered by the Irish Cancer Society will also be given to GPs.

The National Cancer Control Programme established a transition team to plan the transfer of services from Sligo General Hospital. The transition team is being led by Dr Mary Hynes, Cancer Network Manager West. Meetings and discussions have been held with managerial, nursing and clinical staff in Sligo General Hospital and Galway University Hospital. Other staff are involved as appropriate.

The NCCP has received assurances from hospital management in UHG and the National Hospitals Office that no cuts will be made in Cancer services or in the Cancer budget for Galway. The Cancer Programme is a high priority for the HSE and for government and the funding that has been put in place is secure.

"That the Health Forum be provided with up to date details including the identity of each property rented by the Health Service Executive in Sligo and Leitrim and the annual rent paid for each of the said properties, and further to ask if the HSE has planning permission for its various offices in Sligo including offices located at 25, Pearse Crescent, Sligo., at St Francis the Mall, Sligo, and at 10, The Mall, Sligo, and to ask if HSE management ensures that all planning requirements are fulfilled in advance of leasing or renting private properties for HSE use."

HSE Reply:

The member was already provided with details of rentals in March 2009 (copy of that response attached).

The template outlined the:-

- Location of the Rental
- Date of the Rental Agreement
- Purpose of the Lease
- Service Area Utilising the Lease
- Area in Sq feet.

The HSE have an agenda to significantly reduce the volumes and costs of rentals and are working actively on the agenda. The Local Health Office in Sligo/Leitrim have occupied part of the "Old Nazareth House" for the provision of Clinical and associated services. This approach will facilitate the termination of some of the existing leases and facilitate a more integrated approach to service delivery.

The HSE is actively re-negotiating all rentals to achieve significant reductions, and to terminate other leases. Accordingly, the member will appreciate that it would not be appropriate to put in to the public domain costs per square metre for each facility.

In relation to Planning Permission, part of the lease requirement mandates that the proprietor holds appropriate Planning Permission.

In relation to named properties the following is the response:-

25 Pearse Crescent

This facility, is used by the "Learning and After Care Services" to educate/train clients leaving the "Care System" in terms of domestic/living Skills – activities of daily living. Accordingly, it is used as a "domestic home" setting and does not require Planning Permission.

St Francis, The Mall

Planning Permission has been granted for use as "office type" accommodation.

W22Q440 - Councillor Mary Hoade

"Recent policy (14th May) by the HSE for staffing and vehicle types for private medical insured patients which is being implemented requires that there are 2 Paramedics and a type B CEN ambulance, for patient transfers (non urgent) by Private Ambulance companies.

Why has there been no discussion or notice given to the private companies involved? There has been no lead in time and there are not enough paramedics trained up. There is currently no access to private training for paramedics, will this training be opened to the current EMT's?

Is the role of Emergency Medical Technician now defunct (as there will be no training ground) and what are the HSE planning to do with their EMT staff currently about 10% of staff, also non compliant vehicles and at what cost? Is the use of this level of service provision required in the transport of non acute patients? The fleet of type A vehicle will be unusable, again there is no evidence that this type of vehicle is not suitable for the transfer of non acute patients.

Smaller Private Ambulances companies will go out of business with the loss of many jobs. Do the HSE have the capacity to deal with the workload that will occur from a finance of HR perspective, if this happens? Transfers by Paramedics will cost more than by EMT's, Paramedics will loose their skills if involved solely in PTS, by private companies who do not have an ASI contract, how will this situation be overcome?"

HSE Reply:

In late 2008, early 2009 the HSE met with the Private Health Insurance companies to advise them that it would be seeking advice from the Clinical Indemnity Scheme regarding any potential corporate or clinical liabilities it may have when private ambulance providers transport private patients to and from public hospitals, as part of the continuum of care. As soon as this advice was received, the HSE immediately notified the private health insurance companies (the contracting authority for private ambulance companies) of its requirements in this regard.

The HSE requested the private health insurance companies to advise the private ambulance companies operating on their behalf as the contracting authority, that two paramedics and a category B CEN-compliant ambulance would be required to transport private patients in the care of the HSE. To date no objection has been received from the private health insurance companies with respect to this.

With regard to paramedical staff, there are only two training institutions accredited by the Pre-Hospital Emergency Care Council (a statutory body). These are the National Ambulance Service College in conjunction with UCD, and the Dublin Fire Brigade in conjunction with RCSI.

Over the last eighteen months the National Ambulance Service College (NASC) has been operating at full capacity, so much so that it had to open a second campus at Ballinasloe. This was mainly due to an unprecedented level of recruitment of student paramedics coupled with the ongoing training of advanced paramedics and the upskilling of current staff.

As in previous years, as capacity becomes available, the NASC will recommence training private candidates and candidates from other state agencies.

The HSE has a number of staff who will not qualify to register at the paramedic level. The HSE is engaging with staff representative bodies to develop procedures and processes to deal with this small cohort of staff, whilst ensuring that they continue to have a meaningful role within the service. It is likely that these staff will operate at an intermediate care level. The current standard for staff operating on emergency ambulances is one EMT and

one Paramedic as a minimum. The role of the EMT is not a matter for the HSE from a standards perspective, rather it is the role of the professional registration body.

Prior to the inception of the HSE, a number of the former health boards developed a five-year replacement cycle for emergency ambulances. This has continued and over the last three years, 182 new emergency ambulances have purchased and built to CEN1789 Category B standards. This leaves 13 non-CEN Compliant vehicles across the country out of a fleet of more than 300 vehicles. These will be replaced this year as part of the replacement programme, at which stage the HSE emergency ambulance fleet will be 100% CEN 1789 Category B Compliant, placing Ireland at the forefront in Europe.

The primary HSE focus is to deliver high quality patient and client care in a safe and appropriate manner. The current standard in place for the transportation of high and low acuity patients is an EMT and a paramedic as a minimum. Should another standard be introduced, the HSE will consider and adopt, as appropriate.

Skill retention is a requirement for all clinically trained staff, dependent on the speciality and the case volume. This is particularly challenging for the ambulance service as it provides a range of emergency and urgent services to rural and remote communities with low volumes of emergency and urgent activity. As a consequence of this and in accordance with best practice, the National Ambulance Service provides upskilling and skill retention programmes for its entire operational frontline staff. This helps deal with any potential skill attrition issues.

CEIS (for children aged 0-6 years with a disability and complex needs) team were developed in Clare in 2003 using a partnership model between the HSE and a number of non-statutory agencies, namely the Brothers of Charity, Enable Ireland and Clare Federation.

There is ongoing development with the rollout of Clare Children's Services (for children aged 6-18 years with a disability and complex needs) in 2006/2007. We are striving to provide specialist interdisciplinary team services at network level to support the Primary Care Teams in Clare.

"What effects will the recent announcement by Sean McGrath, HSE regarding the non-renewal of temporary contracts have on Letterkenny Hospital and will derogations of this be allowed?"

HSE Reply:

The recent announcement by Sean McGrath, HR Manager, HSE that staff on temporary contracts less that 12 months may not have them renewed will have a significant impact on service delivery in LGH if it goes ahead. There are over 30 contracts that fall into this category, spread across the disciplines, the biggest number being 22 in nursing. We have options around reassignments and redeployments and we are pursuing these. We will be

making a case on some individual contracts to demonstrate clearly the essential nature of the posts to front line service delivery. There are certain named posts such as medical consultants, speech & language therapists, physiotherapists, OTs, social workers and EMTs that are exempt from this announcement, their temp contract should be able to be renewed.

The total number of front line staff recruited in Galway City and County this year to date is 319. This includes 30 front line staff recruited on a permanent hire basis and 289 front line staff recruited on a temporary hire basis.

W22Q450 - Councillor Sean McGowan

"To again ask the Executive what is the up to date position in relation to the provision of the new Community hospital / day centre at Carrick-on Shannon and has a Planning application been lodged with Leitrim Co. Council for the Community Nursing unit in Ballinamore, when is it schedule to open?

Has the funding been secured for both of these projects, will the current financial situation that we are in put either or both of those projects at risk?"

HSE Reply:

Carrick-on Shannon - Community Hospital/Day Centre.

This project is not included in the NDP Plan for 2009. It will receive further consideration for inclusion in the 2010 Plan and the outcome of this review will not be know until 1st Qtr 2010.

Ballinamore - Community Nursing Unit/Day Hospital/Primary Care Unit

The Design Process is ongoing, the preliminary design is completed. It is hoped to have all design work completed by end of July 2009 which would allow a planning application to be submitted. Construction is programmed to commence in early 2010, but this stage requires approval by the National Director of Estates.

Funding has been secured for Ballinamore in 2009 to allow the design/planning process to proceed as outlined above and as already stated, funding for construction is subject to approval to proceed with construction.

W22Q451 - Councillor Catherine Connolly

"Please clarify the position in relation to the empty house in Newcastle No. 1 /Mass Path and in particular whether it is owned and/or leased by the HSE West, when it was acquired and the cost of same whether purchased and/or ongoing rent/lease, what if anything it has been used for, how long it is now empty and the reasons for same and what the HSE West intends to do with the building now."

HSE Reply:

Unit 9A is an approved in patient facility under the Mental Health Treatment Act and provides for the long stay needs of people from the catchment area.

The inspector of Mental Health further to the 2008 report made a number of recommendations regarding Unit 9A Merlin Park.

A Consultant Psychiatrist visits the unit regularly and all patients in this approved centre are reviewed. A multidisciplinary approach is used in this process and Occupational Therapy input has been increased.

A major refurbishment programme has commenced in this unit and is soon to be completed. There is a reduction in patient numbers to address the privacy issues surrounding room sharing.

W22Q453 - Councillor Catherine Connolly

"How many patients at Unit 9A have been identified to move to the new community residence in Tearmann Eanna, whether these patients and their families have been informed of this move/plan and when and what progress if any has now been made in relation to opening up the empty building known as Tearmann Eanna."

HSE Reply:

To date seven patients have been identified as suitable to move. They and their families are aware that they are to transfer to this facility. A meeting has been scheduled for July 22nd to discuss proposals regarding development and opening of the house in the near future. We anticipate that we can move forward with this shortly.

As you are aware this accommodation was provided by Coiste Tearmann Eanna for the provision of services to people from the locality who are patients of the Mental Health Services. Unfortunately it has not been possible to facilitate the transfer of these individuals to date because of funding difficulties and the cost associated with the provision of the model of care proposed. We are now reviewing this proposal with a view to determining whether a revised care plan can be developed having regard to the needs of the individuals concerned and the funding available.
