Introduction

The aim of this document is to provide guidance to clinicians (consultants, SpRs and nurses) working in GI endoscopy Following a review of published guidelines and position papers for endoscopic surveillance in a variety of conditions, it is the view of the HSE Acute Operations Endoscopy Programme that the following guidelines and position papers should be adopted by all GI endoscopy services in Ireland. However, pending the development of a national genetics and genomics strategy, we recognise that it is not possible to fully operationalise all aspects of this guideline, but we do suggest adherence to recommendations about endoscopic surveillance.
