Asthma Action Plan	An Asthma Action Plan is a written, step by step guide to help you manage your asthma and recognise when it's getting worse. Your Asthma Action Plan is filled out with your GP or asthma nurse, who will make sure the plan is completely tailored to your child. Inhaler technique	asthma flare. Asthma is a chronic lung condition that affects the airways in the lungs. Asthma is usually treated by using an inhaler. This a small device that is used with a spacer to help you breathe in medicines.

Allergy Action Plan	A food allergy occurs when the body's immune system reacts abnormally to a food. Food allergy is common, occurring in around 5-6% of young children in Ireland*. The Irish Food Allergy Network has developed a plan on how to manage an allergic reaction. You can download a copy on www.IFAN.ie

Adrenaline Auto-injector administration	Adrenaline is used to treat severe allergic reactions (anaphylaxis). Adrenaline rapidly reverses the effects of anaphylaxis by reducing throat swelling, opening the airways and maintaining blood pressure. Adrenaline is prescribed to individuals to use in emergencies; if your child is at risk of anaphylaxis or had a previous episode of anaphylaxis they will need to carry at least two adrenaline pens at all times.
