**Maternal Sepsis**

Actions required By Whom: Hospital Group CEOs, Hospital CEOs and Managers, Clinical Directors, Obstetric Clinicians, Acute Hospitals, Maternity Hospitals and Maternity Units, and Directors of Midwifery and Nursing.

By When: For IMMEDIATE ACTION in Maternity Hospitals and Acute Hospitals. Please ensure that this is brought to the attention of all relevant staff.

Learning:

With regard to the recognition of sepsis and its protean manifestation in pregnancy and the puerperium, there has been a lot of education around the IMEWS and the importance of documentation of vital signs and escalation protocols. All staff should also be aware of less common presentations of sepsis - where temperature is normal or reduced, where behaviour is altered and where pain is out of proportion to the findings on examination.

Group A streptococcus can be extremely virulent and in some studies leads to 50% mortality.
