Screening Service

This service offers a hearing screen to the approx. 55,000 eligible new-born babies. This include babies born in acute maternity units, those born outside of the maternity unit setting, and babies who spent more than 48hours in Special Care Baby

Units and/or Neonatal Intensive Care Unit by 44 weeks

gestational age using agreed national protocols for screening.



The service ensures effective and efficient referral to HSE diagnostic audio logical services for those babies who need referring as per the agreed Care Pathways.

Tender Contract Details

1.0 Explanation of Requirement

- The HSE conducted a tender process for the continued operation of the National Universal New-born Hearing Screening Service as the current contract will expire on 31st July 2024. The programme, developed by the HSE, was rolled out in April 2011 and became a National programme in November 2013. The programme is informed by international best practice and evidence with particular input from the UK NHSP model. It involves screening all new-born infants. This results in the early identification of congenital Permanent Childhood Hearing Loss (PCHL) leading to early intervention and much improved outcomes for children. Currently there is an estimated incidence of hearing loss of approximately 1-2/1000 or 60-120 children diagnosed with a hearing impairment per year as a result of introducing the programme. Screening can also help in the early detection of unilateral or bilateral moderate to profound permanent childhood hearing impairment.
- Aims to reduce the age of identification of such hearing loss to not more than three
 months and to undertake/commence amplification, fitting and enrolment in early
 intervention programmes by age six months.
- The service provider will be expected to offer and provide new-born hearing screening in accordance with HSE Care Pathways, Protocols and Appendices to all eligible newborn babies in the relevant hospitals, between the hours of 9am to 6pm, 7 days per week.
- NEC Software Solutions UK Limited are currently providing the New-born Hearing Screening Service.

- The cost has increased broadly in line with inflation which was 21% since the original contract price.

2.0 Procurement Market

- The Procurement Evaluation Group had conducted market research in advance of the tender process and contacted a number of Hearing test providers to establish if they had the capacity to undertake the service.
- This market research informed the HSE that the market is very restricted and indicated that only one service provider would have the capacity.
- NEC Software Solutions UK Limited is the key supplier and the current incumbent.

3.0 Procurement Strategy

- A combined PEG was formed consisting of the National Clinical Lead and the Assistant National Clinical Lead in Audiology, the National Clinical Lead in Child Health Public Health / National Healthy Childhood Programme, plus the Project Manager in Child Health Screening Programmes.
- The market for this specialist and niche service is extremely limited therefore an open tender competition was published to achieve maximum market reach.


4.0 Procurement Process

- The tender process was conducted under Annex XIV of Procurement directives 2014/24/EU.
- The required services are listed as Annex XIV services, and accordingly, only Articles 74 to 77 of Directive 2014/24/EC applies to the award of any contract(s) that arise from this process.
- Just one tender submission was received.
- Following analysis of the submission, the tender was approved to proceed to evaluation under the award criteria.
- Negotiations were not conducted with the incumbent supplier as the tendered cost was within the available budget
- The PEG's comments and scores under each of the award criteria are shown in Appendix D.



5.0 Value for Money

- One tender response from NEC Software Solutions was received and evaluated and the tendered cost per screen was

- A change control notice on the previous contract was signed off on 01.02.22.
- This increased the screening cost from to December 2023 was 21% (see CSO graph below).

6.0 Environmental Impact Statement

- Tenderers were required to demonstrate how they propose to deliver and manage a HSE contract setting out details of any environmental and/or sustainable initiatives they propose to adopt in the provision of the required service.
- Tenderers were directed to the 'Green Public Procurement: Guidance for the Public Sector' published by the EPA in 2021 and requested to outline any particular policies or initiatives they have in place in relation to the delivery of this contract which responds to this EPA document. Sustainability formed part of the Award Criteria
- NEC Software Solutions have committed to being Net Zero by 2030.
- Environmental Achievements and initiatives of NEC Software Solutions
 - They have achieved independently audited reduction of 64% in tonnes of carbon dioxide equivalent (tC02e). They have achieved this by;
 - Property rationalisation and moves to more environmentally friendly office space, saving 873 tCO2e through reductions in energy use.
 - Extensive refurbishments of multiple offices, including installation of 572 more energy efficient LED lights.
 - Replacement of elderly hot water heaters in kitchens with new 'Virgin' purified water / hot water devices.
 - Only using energy from renewable energy sources.
 - Not providing single use plastics and installing continuous bin liners, resulting in a reduction of 19,000 items of plastic used.
 - Installation of electric vehicle charging points.
 - Provision of mixed recycling facilities resulting in a 17% increase in waste recycled.
 - Reducing the use of consumables, such as paper which we have reduced by 1,500 reams per year.
 - Their emissions are monitored and recorded in line with the Streamlined Energy and Carbon Reporting (SECR) regulations and the relevant areas of the Greenhouse Gas ('GHG') Protocol Corporate Accounting and Reporting Standard.
 - They have an Environmental Aspect and Impact Register (EAIR), down to site level through which to capture the elements of operating practices which could impact the environment. Each aspect has an impact description and significance score together with proposed actions, targets and measures against which to assess progress. This has reduced their environmental impact across their property portfolio.
 - Other measures include using advanced green technology for cooling in their data centres and implementing a strategy to achieve 'zero to landfill' for waste under their control.
 - NEC have implemented specific initiatives for this contract to include reducing energy use, flexible working to reduce travel, green champions, environmental impact training and an environmental aspect and impact register.



7.0 Budget

- The budget holder an Assistant National Director, Head of Operations, Primary Care approved an available budget of for this screening service.
- This budget covers the 48 month initial contract and the 2 x 12 month extension periods.
- The Child Health Screening Programme had identified the available budget to be in the region of over the lifetime of the contract.

8.0 Risk Management

- This contract is subject to the HSE's Standard Terms & Conditions Version 8.2.
- The initial term of this Contract will be for 48 months (the "Term") with 2 x 12 month extension periods possible.
- Risk Identification and Management formed part of the Award Criteria for this tender process and form part of the Service Level Agreement.
- NEC Software Solutions employ a six step risk management methodology;
 - Define/ Refine Risk Management Approach
 - Risk Identification
 - Risk Evaluation
 - Risk Mitigation
 - Response/ Implementation
 - Monitor, Review and Adjust
- The NEC Risk Management Methodology will enable risks to be jointly managed by NEC and the HSE as part of overall service management. Risks, when identified, will be recorded on a shared risk register, which will be reviewed during future Contract Management Team review meetings, or if potentially critical, in a more urgent timescale.
- The risk register will provide a consolidated repository of risks associated with the ongoing service and any project related activity, such as system upgrades, equipment changes and service enhancements.
- Risks will be recorded in the register as they are identified, regardless of whether identified by NEC or the HSE.
- All risks will be evaluated according to the likelihood of occurrence and the impact each risk will have. The risk log template automatically calculates an overall score and colour coding (Red, Amber or Green) for the risk. The colour coding can be used to prioritise risk management, with red risks managed first, then amber and then green. Once risks have been identified and evaluated, suitable responses or actions will be identified, regardless of whether identified by NEC, the HSE or any third party supplier.
- NEC Software Solutions are required to produce KPI reports (3 months in arrears) relating to screening numbers and outcomes for monitoring by the HSE's Universal Hearing Screening Programme Governance Group.
- The SLA addresses quality standards and national policy standards that the service provider must meet in order to ensure each patient gets the best quality. The national universal newborn hearing screening programme has been informed by international best practice and evidence with particular input from the UK NHSP model.
- Corporate and Quality/Social Care Governance are covered in the SLA.
- The Service Provider will have in place governance arrangements with defined management processes, organisational roles, responsibilities and reporting relationships, which support the provision of safe and high quality Services and which apply to all staff engaged in provision of the Services.
- The Service Provider will be accountable for the quality of service provision and the effective use of resources.
- The contracted service provider will be expected to have a system of clinical governance in place, with clear and robust lines of responsibility and accountability, enabling the delivery of a quality and standards-driven service.






