Summary: This CAR seeks approval for the appointment of UPMC Kildare

as a provider of dental extractions under general anaesthesia for

children ages 2-16 years in CHOs 6, 7, 8 and 9 areas.

Lot 1 for emergency extractions within one week of the

requirement being notified; and

Lot 2 for extractions within two to six weeks of the requirement

being notified.

UPMC Kildare was the only tender received for both Lots.

Procurement Process Type: Annex XIV of Procurement directives 2014/24/EU.

Issues encountered: Market analysis is there is a lack of interest from private

providers due to the lack of capacity in the market place. The tender deadline was extended by one month (the tender was in



the market for over two months in total) to maximise interest in the tender.

Tender Contract Details

1.0 Explanation of Requirement

- In June 2023, the Primary Care Manager for CHO 7 initially submitted a PSR (22185) for a combined tender for dental extractions for children under general anaesthesia for the CHOs 6, 7 and 9 areas. The requirement was for hospital-based services and the extractions could only be provided by dentists or oral surgeons.
- During this time a PSR (HSE 22604) for similar requirements was received from CHO
 Their requirement was for the treatment of approx. children per year.
- HSE Procurement recommended that a single tender competition for all four CHOs be published in order to rank providers and appoint to a Panel.
- The total combined CHO requirements were for approximately patients per year requiring dental extraction under general anaesthesia.
- It was noted by the PEG that this demand is likely to increase in the coming years.

2.0 Procurement Market

- There are a limited number of private hospitals in Ireland who are currently capable of providing dental extractions under general anaesthesia.
- There are capacity restraints both in terms of access to theatre sessions in the private hospitals and of the limited number of qualified dentists and oral surgeons available for private work.
- In addition, some of the patients in the 2-16 year age category have special needs and some private providers cannot accommodate such patients.

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3.0 Procurement Strategy

- The PEG consisted of Principal Dental Surgeons from each of the four CHOs participating plus the General Manager of Primary Care in CHO 7 who implemented and managed the MOU (Memorandum of Understanding).
- The requirement was addressed by two Lots:
- Lot 1 For urgent requirements within one week of the requirement being notified and
- Lot 2: For within 2 6 weeks of the requirement being notified.
- The Lots were evaluated separately.
- Once Providers were ranked, CHOs could cascade through the ranking and refer
 patients based on price, capacity / availability, geographical convenience for the
 patient being referred and clinical need / urgency of the patient requirement. This
 allowed for a choice of provider in the case of patients from socio-economic groups
 who would not be in a position to access facilities other than those relatively close
 by and in which public transport was available. In addition, as the patients to be
 treated are children they would need to be accompanied by a responsible adult for
 their treatment thus adding to the logistical issues in accessing treatment.

4.0 Procurement Process


- The tender process was conducted under Annex XIV of Procurement directives 2014/24/EU.
- The required services are listed as Annex XIV services, and accordingly, only Articles 74 to 77 of Directive 2014/24/EC applies to the award of any contract(s) that arise from this process. This gives significant flexibility when running a tender competition.
- An open tender competition for this requirement was published on 19 November 2023 with an initial deadline date of 22 December 2023.
- Some weeks into the tendering period it was noticed that only one private healthcare hospital, UPMC, had viewed the tender opportunity. The PEG supplied contact details of known providers throughout the four CHO regions and HSE Procurement alerted these providers to the tender opportunity.
- The tender deadline was extended significantly from 22 December 2023 to 24 January 2024.
- On opening the tender box on 24 January just one tender was received from UPMC Kildare.
- Following analysis of the submission, the tender was approved to proceed to evaluation under the award criteria.
- The PEG's comments and scores under each of the award criteria are shown in Appendix D.

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5.0 Value for Money

• One tender response was received, from UPMC Kildare for both Lots.



6.0 Environmental Impact Statement

- Tenderers were required to demonstrate how they propose to deliver and manage a HSE contract setting out details of any environmental and/or sustainable initiatives they propose to adopt in the provision of the required service.
- Tenderers were directed to the 'Green Public Procurement: Guidance for the Public Sector' published by the EPA in 2021 and requested to outline policies or initiatives they have in place in relation to the delivery of this contract in line with the EPA Was there award criteria or mandatory?

7.0 Budget

• The budget holders in CHO 6, 7, 8 and 9 confirmed that funding is available for the duration of the contract.

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8.0 Risk Management

- This contract is subject to the HSE's Standard Terms & Conditions Version 8.2.
- The initial term of this Contract is for 24 months with the option of 2 x 12 month extensions.
- Specific risk management clauses per the HSE ITT (Invitation to Tender) document include a provision that the successful economic provider shall have in place on the commencement date of the contract, all insurance as required by the Contract and shall put in place additional levels of insurance, if required and requested by the HSE.
- At the final stage of the award phase, the HSE budget holders will arrange an inspection of the practice premises from which the service is to be provided.
- The HSE reserves the right to inspect the practice at any time during the life of the contract. If the provider subsequently fails any part of the practice inspection the contract will be suspended with immediate effect.
- The provider is required to assist and cooperate with any HSE investigation of any incident/near miss/adverse outcome in compliance with HSE Incident Management Framework. The provider will be required to communicate the outcome of any complaints received by the hospital in relation to the contracted service.
- If the provider accepts HSE patients but fails to meet the agreed timeframes specified, they will be subject to appropriate sanctions.

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9.0 Contract Management

- The contract will be managed by each CHO referring patients, and each CHO will provide a point of contact to liaise with the provider.
- The specification included detailed clauses on, inter alia, how patient referrals will be made and how the provider must schedule appointments.
- The contract will be subject to review on an on-going basis by each CHO budget holder, in conjunction with HSE Procurement as required

10.0 Approval

The Procurement Team recommends the award of this contract as detailed above and confirms:

- The procurement process detailed above complies fully with Statutory Instrument No. 284 of 2016 EUROPEAN UNION (AWARD OF PUBLIC AUTHORITY CONTRACTS) REGULATIONS 2016 giving effect to Directive 2014/24/EU of the European Parliament and of the Council of 26 February 2014 on public procurement and repealing Directive 2004/18/EC; HSE Procurement Policy; and HSE National Financial Regulations;
