Approval for appointing UPMC Kildare to provide Dental Extractions for Children Under General Anaesthesia as required in CHOs 6, 7 and 9 following an open tender competition.

Brief summary of link to Board objectives. The HSE is required to comply with the Procurement Regulations and Guidelines. The Award of the Contract will ensure the HSE complies with its obligations.
Background - provide context in order to ensure that the Board fully understand the issue.
 In June 2023, the Primary Care Manager for CHO 7 initially submitted a PSR (22185) for a combined tender for dental extractions for children under general anaesthesia for the CHOs 6, 7 and 9 areas. The requirement was for hospital-based services and the extractions could only be provided by dentists or oral surgeons.
 During this time a PSR (HSE 22604) for similar requirements was received from CHO 8. Their requirement was for the treatment of approx.
• HSE Procurement recommended that a single tender competition for all four CHOs be published in order to rank providers and appoint to a Panel.
• The total combined CHO requirements were for approximately patients per year requiring dental extraction under general anaesthesia.
• It was noted by the PEG that this demand is likely to increase in the coming years.

Current status

There are currently non procurement compliant local arrangements in place in CHOs 6, 7 and 9 areas for these dental services which must be hospital-based.

<u>Budget</u>

The budget holders in CHO 6, 7, 8 and 9 confirmed that funding is available for the duration of the contract.

Impact to delivery of services

The contract will allow reduction in waiting lists for these dental services thus improving health outcomes for children.

Corporate Plan

The implementation of contract will deliver an element of the target Spend Under Management (SUM) for Procurement.

Conclusion

The implementation of the contract is essential for the HSE to move into compliance with its obligations under the Procurement Regulations and to allow the CHOs address waiting lists for these specialist dental services necessary to meet its service commitments.
