Background
This paper provides an update for the Board on the HSE planning and service delivery response for people fleeing from Ukraine and International Protection Applicants (IPAs) arriving in Ireland.
As of the 13 th October 2022 53,239 people from Ukraine have entered Ireland. 42,140 of those have sought emergency accommodation in IPAS. As at 13 th October 2022 approximately 11,000 IPAs have arrived in Ireland year to date.
The enclosed paper provides an overview of the current situation regarding volumes of displaced people arriving in Ireland and their accommodation arrangements. It also summarises the current operational response and planning work to deliver a future whole of organisation service delivery model in the context of the ongoing emergency response to the war in Ukraine and continuing arrivals from Ukraine alongside International Protection Applicants.

Please note this is a working document and under active review. The Risk Register is shared internally and with the Department of Health on a weekly basis and with the Humanitarian SOG as requested.
