Patient Advocacy Service

The Patient Advocacy Service is a free and confidential service, independent of the HSE, that provides information and support to people who want to make a complaint about an experience they have had in a HSE public acute hospital or a HSE operated nursing home through the HSE's Your Service Your Say process or through the HSE's Incident Management Framework, where a person has been involved in a patient safety incident.



The HSE has developed a <u>Memorandum of Understanding</u> (MoU) with the Patient Advocacy Service that sets out their commitment to ensure that people receive a timely, compassionate and comprehensive response to their complaints. The MoU recognises that every person has the right to make a complaint about the service they have received from HSE public Acute hospitals, while the HSE also recognises the important role that independent patient advocacy can play in the HSE's complaints processes, <u>'Your Service Your Say'</u> and the <u>Incident Management Framework</u>.
