


The Long & Winding Road: Paving the way for rehabilitation development in Ireland



Defining rehabilitation


"A set of interventions designed to optimise functioning & reduce disability in individuals with health conditions, in interaction with their environment" (WHO, 2021)

WHO Rehabilitation 2030: Call to Action




- ✓ No clear national picture of the range and scope of existing post-acute inpatient rehab services.
- ✓ A lack of understanding on what constitutes a rehab service.



Scope & Methodology

AIM: to map all post-acute inpatient rehabilitation in Ireland and gain an objective understanding of the capacity and capability of these services.

..The foundations to enable **strategic** rehabilitation development and meet anticipated increased demand.

- Survey design based on key international documents
- Stakeholder consultation & pilot testing
- All post-acute inpatient rehabilitation services, with dedicated multi-disciplinary input, across acute hospitals, community services, private and section 38 services.

Data collection & analysis

92% response rate. 43 organisations providing 57 distinct rehab services.

Extensive validation process

Data analysis challenges

35% of initial organisations were deemed out of scope



Some key findings



1336 beds identified as providing post-acute inpatient multidisciplinary rehabilitation, across acute and community settings.

Significant shortfall in number of post-acute rehabilitation beds across all patient cohorts, e.g. 58% shortfall of neuro-rehabilitation beds (Neuro-Rehabilitation Strategy, 2018).

Significant geographical disparity in bed numbers across CHOs (6.4 - 45 beds per 100,000 population).

Deficits in workforce and a mismatch with meeting complex patient needs.



Recommendations

- Develop National Rehabilitation Service Specification, with defined national standards to support their development
- Establish a national rehabilitation data collection system to enable benchmarking and quality improvement at a local, regional and national level.



Further recommendations

- Additional designated rehabilitation beds are required to meet population needs.
- Post-acute rehabilitation in Ireland should be developed with distinct levels of care, to address complexity of need and ensure minimum standards of care related to:
 - Clinical governance
 - Appropriately staffed and skilled workforce
 - Access to evidence-based interventions
