

- 4. Children's health and wellbeing programmes






Population health for children - Why does it matter?

"The foundations for virtually every aspect of human development – physical, intellectual and emotional – are laid in early childhood.

What happens during these early years (starting in the womb) has lifelong effects on many aspects of health and well-being – from obesity, heart disease and mental health to educational achievement and economic status."

Enabling children to have the best possible start in life is essential not only to them but also to healthcare system future sustainability

Children in Ireland

- 25% of the population is <19 years (~54,000 births last year)
- Increasing supports around maternity / parent and parental benefits and childcare
- Increased protection around breastfeeding for mothers
- 21.2% of CYP aged 0-17 years in enforced deprivation, 46.5% in single parent families (CSO, 2025).
- ~4,600 children registered as homeless in Ireland
- Breastfeeding rates low with 31.5% exclusively at 3 months (41% non exclusively)
- 10% CYP live with chronic illness e.g. diabetes, ~33% over-weight and obesity
- ~ 4% (48,000) children have complex ongoing disability needs
- Mental health challenges ever increasing



National Healthy Childhood Programme (NHCP)

Most countries have a 'programme' of what should be 'done' / 'available' to **all children** to support their healthy growth and development.

The NHCP is the HSEs universal programme of clinical care for all children

Of note the child health services (NHCP) is

- Enshrined in law (Health Acts) as core explicit services for delivery
- Enshrined in law that public health have related responsibilities

Core components of the NHCP

The framework of the NHCP outlines the content and timing of the health care activity incorporated as part of the NHCP.

The NHCP includes newborn screening, PHN core service; Infant feeding/lactation support, IMH, oral health promotion, NIP.

Supporting implementation of the NHCP is a standardised CH record used across the country and accompanying practitioner training and resources

Supporting parents and families the MyChild.ie resources (books, webpages; short guides for conditions etc) underpinned by extensive comms and HSE funded campaigns, are critical supporting component






NHCP data 2024 (this is provisional data and may change).

- ~ 54,400 number of children born
- 54,319 no. of initial samples received in the bloodspot screening lab in 2024
- 149 number of cases cases of the nine conditions screened for as part of the NNBSP
- 54,255 babies offered newborn hearing screening. 820 babies referred to audiology (2023 data) 79 babies diagnosed with PCHL
- 226 Breastfeeding services (support groups & education classes) listed on MyChild.ie
- 2,258 contacts with members of the public through the 'Ask our breastfeeding expert' online service
- > **1.155** live chats
- > 1,103 email queries responded to.
- 46,995 My Child: 0 to 2 years books distributed
- 36,417 My Child: 2 to 5 years books distributed
- 301 mychild.ie pages fact-checked as part of 3 year review process (over 550 pages on MyChild.ie)
- 5,937,677 the number of visits to MyChild.ie
 - > 959,824 more visits than 2023
 - > 18.8% growth year on year
- 5,662 staff training across multiple eLearning units and face-to-face training
