The NSO Fellowship aims to:

- Build leadership capacity in simulation-based education.
- Support healthcare professionals in integrating simulation into clinical practice and education.
- Advance a culture of excellence in patient safety and team-based learning through SBE.
- Foster innovation in healthcare education by exploring emerging technologies and methodologies.

Key Features of the Fellowship

- Structured Learning and Development: Fellows will participate in a dedicated programme focusing on the theory and practice of SBE, leadership development, and innovative teaching methodologies.
- Hands-On Experience: Fellows will have the opportunity to design, deliver, and evaluate simulation programmes across diverse clinical settings.
- Collaborative Environment: Work alongside multidisciplinary teams and engage with national and international experts in simulation and healthcare education.

Selection: Successful candidates will be informed of their selection and provided with details for onboarding.
