He manages bilateral programmes with Ministries of Health in Mozambique, Ethiopia, Sudan and Zambia and leads the ESTHER Ireland Programme which supports health personnel to develop links with low and middle income countries.

He is Adjunct Professor in global health at University College Dublin.











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




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#### Mozambique – country profile

#### Jose Maçamo General Hospital

Decreased monthly mortality on medical ward from 11 to 4


















Adopted proven Australian approach: 'Between the Flags'













#### **Mavalane General Hospital**

- Reduced wait times in gynaecologist OPD from 60 days to 30 days
- Trained others and built teams
- Shared with other hospitals
- Improve referral information



















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## Infulene Psychiatric Hospital

- Reduced the absconding of patients to two events a month in males and females from 4 and 6
- 2<sup>nd</sup> project is to decrease waiting times in hospitals

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#### **Matola Provincial Hospital**

- ED wait time reduced to 3 hours
- 2nd project: Increase in satisfaction in orthopaedics









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

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

- MoH co-facilitated interagency workshop on developing national quality framework
















#### 2020 – Jose Maçamo Hospital





Reduction in 24hr mortality

2017 - 58 deaths

2018 - 34 deaths

2019 – 8 deaths









#### 2020 – Mavalene General Hospital



#### Aim (2016)

To reduce gynaecology waiting times from 60 to 30 days

#### Progress (2020)

- Improvement sustained to 2020
- Waiting time reduced to 20 days for 2 visits!
- Approach being applied in other wards










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#### Ongoing prevention of pressure ulcers

**HSE** senior management supported continuation of global health work










# Responding in the pandemic, not just to the pandemic

- Addressed COVID-19 in coaching webinars













- Initiative on mental health of health workers












### **COVID-19** information and resources

- We can do much more to realise mutual benefits from working with low income countries


