


### **Background to NPSO**



- Established in 2016 to strengthen the patient safety role and functions of the Department
- Informed by:
  - Report of the Commission on Patient Safety and Quality Assurance (2008)
  - Strategic Framework for Reform of the Health Service 2012-2015 Future Health
  - HIQA Investigation Reports

### **NPSO Structure**



### Main NPSO areas of work - a selection



- Antimicrobial Resistance (AMR) iNAP 2 action plan
- Clinical Guidelines 7 NCEC national guidelines published by Minister
- National Healthcare Quality Reporting System (NHQRS) measures quality of our healthcare system
- National Care Experience Programme listening to voices of patients and service users

### Main NPSO areas of work - a selection



- Patient Safety Bill mandatory open disclosure of serious patient safety events
- Patient Advocacy Service to facilitate patients in making complaints
- HIQA oversight and governance of the primary Health Regulator
- Complaints and Incidents policies development of national policies





Kindness and civility needs to be encouraged and expected


People need the opportunity to connect and FOSTER POSITIVE RELATIONSHIPS that let them be heard




We each have a part to play in choosing the values and behaviour that guide our relationships, and we each have the power to SUPPORT THE PEOPLE WE WORK WITH


