



 A single or repeated act, or omission, which violates a person's human rights or causes harm or distress to a person. The main areas of abuse which cause people harm are physical abuse, emotional abuse, sexual abuse, neglect of the person and financial abuse. It is important to note that this is not an exhaustive list.

HIQA/ MHC 2019



• Elder abuse is defined as "a single, or repeated act, or lack of appropriate action, occurring within any relationship, where there is an expectation of trust, which causes harm or distress to an older person".

-WHO



- All people have the right to be safe and to live a life free from abuse.
- HSE safeguarding policy expects zero tolerance approach to all concerns of elder abuse. In practice this means that all concerns of abuse or neglect are screened.
- The will and preference of the adult involved should be respected . Minimise risk while respecting the adult's wishes.
- 3 R's Recognise, respond and report



Protective factor:

- Social support/ being socially connected
- Positive family and community networks
- Access to and awareness of support
- Advocates and allies
- Effective Organisational Safety Culture
- Human rights informed model of care



Risk factors:

- Functional dependence/disability, frailty, poor physical health
- Cognitive impairment, mental health status
- Socioeconomic status and poverty
- Age
- Place of residence



- Challenge Ageist language, assumptions, attitudes of "entitlement"
- Openness to believe abuse of older persons can happen
- Maximise communication supports
- Safety culture that sees safeguarding as central to all our interactions
- Just culture that enables staff to speak up without fear
- Competence, authentic leadership and good organisational governance matter



Prevention and awareness messages

- Empowerment of Older people matters
- Staff open to accepting reality of elder abuse. It can and does happen. Prevalence research – 1 in 6 older persons each year
- Safeguarding is everyone's business. Despite rise in reports elder abuse under reporting remains. Community reporting to HSE Safeguarding and Protection Teams remains static despite population growth



Responding messages

- Be informed of indicators of abuse HSeLanD learning resources and published Patient Safety Supplement
- Raise concerns with line manager and person responsible for safeguarding in your organisation
- Respect older person's wishes- Relationships matters Many older people want abuse to stop whilst maintaining important relationships



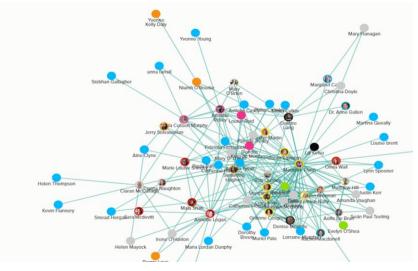




The QPS Ireland Network Map


