The Patient Safety (Notifiable Incidents and Open Disclosure) Act 2023

The Patient Safety Act was signed into law by the President on 02 May 2023 – the commencement date for the Act has not yet been confirmed by the Department of Health but it is anticipated to be Quarter 2 this year. (Access the Act here.)

As part of the HSE's preparation for the commencement of the 2023 Act, work of the HSE Patient Safety Act Implementation Working Group is ongoing. This group is focused on an implementation plan for the Act across HSE and HSE-funded services. The group's membership draws from stakeholders across the health and social care system and includes patient-representatives and advocates; subject matter experts and clinicians; representatives from the Department of Health and legal representatives. 5 work streams focusing on various components of the Act have been established also as follows – NIMS, OD/Incident Management, Notifiable Incidents, Screening, Clinical Audit. In addition a Communications work stream has been established to manage all communications in relation to the Act. Key activities under the implementation working group and each work stream are identified below.

Patient Safety Act Open Disclosure Webinars

HSE & HSE-funded Patient Safety Act Implementation Group

Setting up governance arrangements for implementation
Overseeing overarching implementation plan
Overseeing overarching communication and engagement plan
Development of resources (e-learning, guidance, etc.)
Overseeing compliance requirements in relation to the wider system including HSE-funded organisations

Open Disclosure / Incident Management

Ongoing development of supporting resources including:

- Documentation
 Templates
- PSA Procedure on managing open disclosure
- E-Learning Module on the Role of the Designated Person

Notifiable Incidents (NI) and Legal Clarifications

Ongoing development of guidance/policy on the Notifiable Incidents to support implementation of the Act, through engagement with HSE staff, Department of Health, Regulatory Bodies and other stakeholders.

NIMS

NIMS is being adapted to meet the reporting and notification requirements of the Act. Additionally essential improvements are being made on how patient safety incidents are reported/captured on NIMS. This will be supported with guidance documents and training.

Clinical Audit

Development of a revised definition of clinical audit for HSE and HSE Funded Services.

Align all clinical audit policy, procedure, protocols and guidance with the Act.

Part 5 (Patient Requested Screening) Reviews

Development of guidance on the implementation of the Act as it relates to Patient Requested Reviews.

Comparison of the current review processes across the three screening programmes.

Communications Work Stream

A Communications Work Stream has been established with direct support from the HSE Communications Team. A Communications Plan has been developed. A deliverable of this work stream will be to publish the working group's governance documents, provide updates and manage communications to all stakeholders on the Act.

Supporting Implementation of the Patient Safety Act

In preparation for commencement of the Act, staff leading out on national implementation have planned a number of presentations on the detail of the Act with services across the operational system. We are working closely with the Open Disclosure Leads in the planning of these visits.

The HSE National Open Disclosure Office, QPS Incident Management team will continue to support all services, and work with Open Disclosure Leads and Trainers as we transition to the new Regional Health Areas and adjust to the new structure.

Measurement of Patient Experience of Open Disclosure

A key part of the Open Disclosure Performance Measurement Programme is the development of a patient experience survey or other assessment tool to measure patient / relevant person experience following the open disclosure process. This work is being undertaken in collaboration with Professor Aoife DeBrún (UCD) and a multi stakeholder working group which includes Patient Representatives and Advocates. A Co-design Workshop will be held in April, following which the research team will prepare a Report and Recommendations for the HSE.
