Enable Irish health and social care services to:

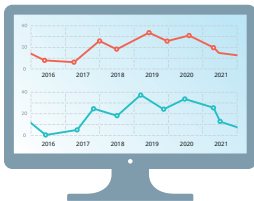
1. monitor and reduce avoidable harm, and

This will be achieved by:



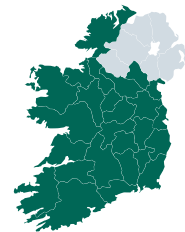
Making it easy for stakeholders at every level to access and interrogate data and information on the quality and safety of services.

Evaluating and disseminating learnings from areas of excellence to support nationwide improvement.



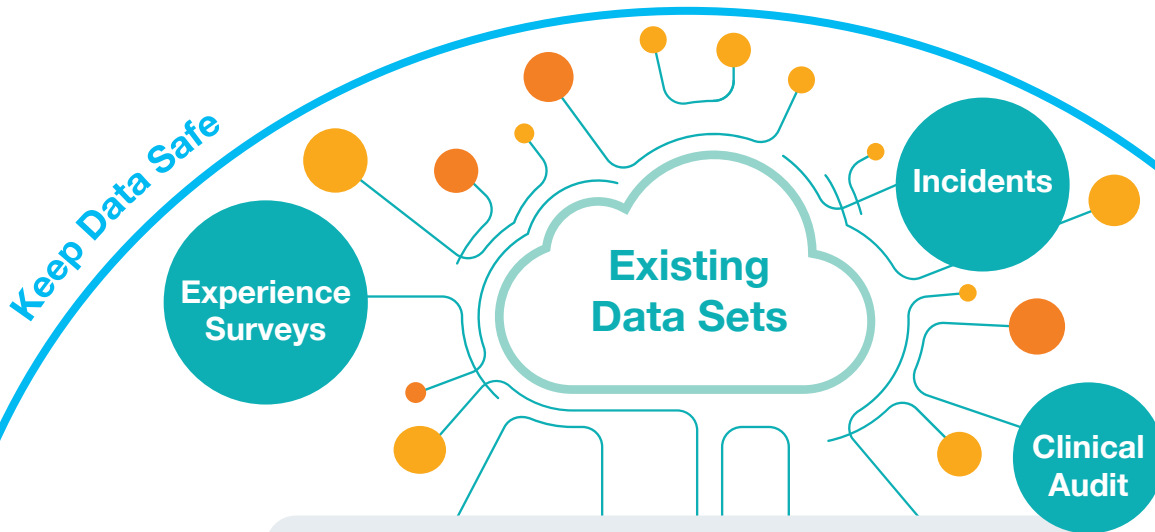
National Women & Infants Health Programme

Proof of Concept in Maternity Services (2023-2024)

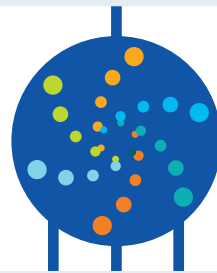
