## PQ 5568/18

\* To ask the Minister for Health the measures in place to warn drug users regarding the dangers of a drug (details supplied); the number of drug overdose cases in which this drug has been linked; and if he will make a statement on the matter.

Details supplied: Fentanyl

Dear Deputy Chambers,

The Health Service Executive has been requested to reply directly to your above Parliamentary Question which you submitted to the Minister for Health for response. I have examined the matter and the following outlines the position:

In 2015 there were 7 poisoning deaths where Fentanyl was implicated (the latest data available). Between 2011 and 2014 there were less than 5 poisoning deaths where fentanyl was implicated. Arising from a number of drug related deaths in Dublin and Cork in 2016, the HSE issued an alert in relation to the dangers of a class of Opiate drugs known as Fentanyls. Since 2016 there has not been a significant issue reported in Ireland associated with Fentanyl type drugs.

The situation continues to be closely monitored in conjunction with An Gárda Siochána, colleagues in Northern Ireland and the Early Warning system of the EMCDDA.
