This medicine protocol is a specific written instruction for the administration of Boostrix to Refugees and Applicants Seeking Protection in Ireland (hereafter referred to as vaccine recipients) and in the event of an outbreak as advised by public health by registered nurses and registered midwives. This medicine protocol is valid for the 2024/2025 Health Service Executive (HSE), Schools Immunisation Programme (SIP) and National Immunisation Advisory Committee (NIAC) catch up Immunisation Programme, Boostrix vaccination during pregnancy in line with the NIAC recommendations and in the event of an outbreak as advised by public health.

This medicine protocol enables registered nurses and registered midwives employed in the voluntary and statutory services of the HSE including Mass vaccination clinics who have undertaken the required education and training programmes to administer Boostrix with reference to and guidance from Nursing & Midwifery Board of Ireland (NMBI) , National Immunisation Advisory Committee (NIAC), National Immunisation Office (NIO), HSE and in accordance with the Summary of Product Characteristics (SmPC) for Boostrix as detailed by the Health Products Regulatory Authority (HPRA) at www.hpra.ie
