What is Vaccine Hesitancy?

- $\sqrt{\mbox{An expression of concern or doubt about}}$ value or safety of vaccination
- √ Indecision and reluctance
- √ Continuum between vaccine acceptance and vaccine refusal
- X It is not Pro vaccine/ anti vaccine





What is Vaccine Hesitancy?

Antivaccine

VACCINATION BELIEFS

Provaccine



- Unimmunized
- · Completely reject vaccines
- · High safety concerns
- Lack trust in health care provider

Vaccine-Hesitant

- · Under- immunized
- · Delay/question vaccines
- · Select only certain vaccines
- Desire trustworthy health care provider

Vaccine Acceptor

- · Fully Immunized
- Few concerns about vaccines
- High trust in health care provider





Vaccine Hesitancy

 Up to one-third of parents in US have concerns about recommended vaccination schedules and express distrust /reluctance to have their children vaccinated*

Widely heterogeneous group of parents

- Unquestioning acceptor (30-40%)
- Cautious acceptor
- Hesitant
- - Late/selective
- - Refuser (<2%)





Confidence


 do not trust vaccine or provider




Communication Strategy

Be prepared

Have evidence-based knowledge of

- Vaccines- what they are and how they work
- Diseases that vaccines prevent
- Common side effects
- The risks of not vaccinating
- Appropriate information materials



Time to discuss and answer questions





Communication

- Be well informed, open and honest
- Avoid academic jargon
- Listen
- Elicit specific concerns (parents don't all have the same concerns)
- Acknowledge their concerns: "What you have read on the internet must be worrying you"
- Don't bring up new concerns





Communication

Inform about benefits and risks accurately

Include consequences of not vaccinating



Frame your message

A vaccine is 99% safe © Vs there is a 1% risk of side effects ©

50% wholegrain cereal © Vs 50% ???? ⊗

Communication

- Stay on message
- --Vaccines are safe and effective
- --Recommended by independent experts
- --Higher safety standards than drugs



- Give or point them in direction of appropriate resources
- Any decisions that are made, whether to give or withhold vaccines must be respected
