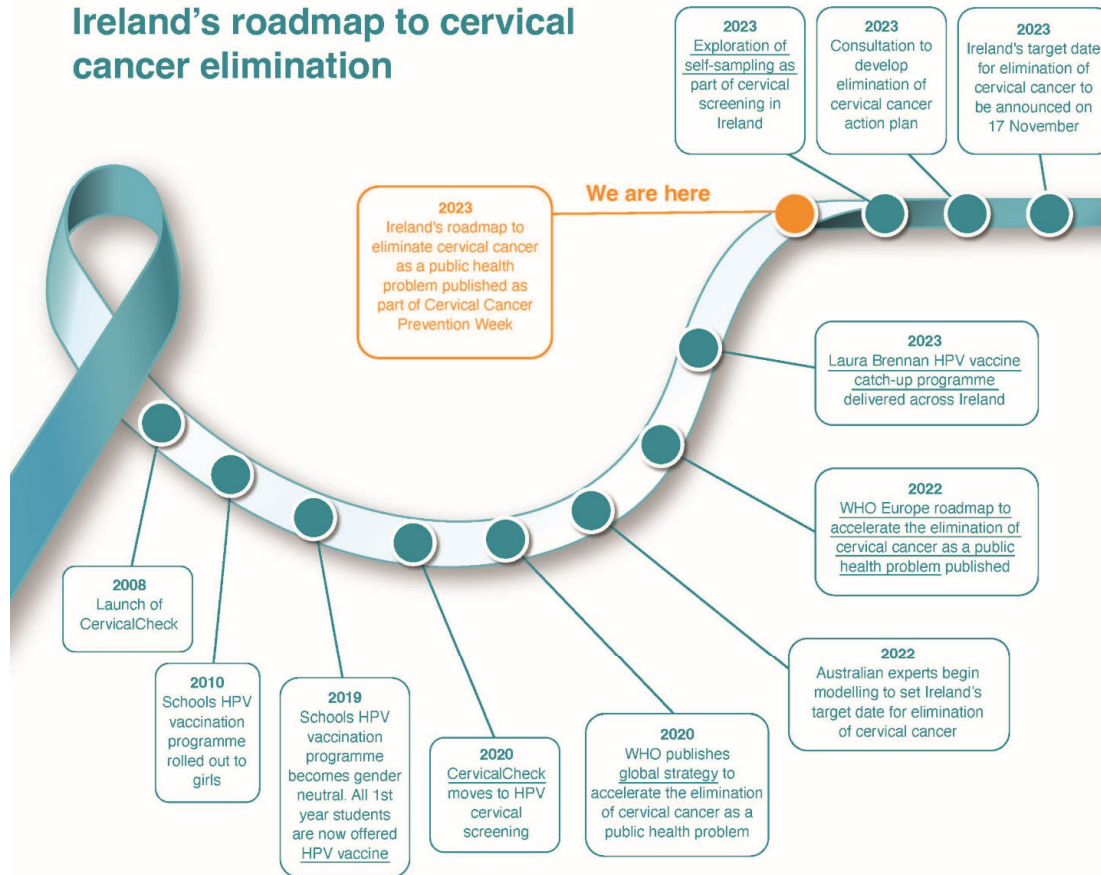

# Cervical Cancer Prevention Week

## Ireland's roadmap to cervical cancer elimination



### WHO Target

Incidence rate of  
**4 per 100,000**

**90%**  
of girls fully vaccinated with HPV vaccine by age 15 years.

**70%**  
of women are screened with a high-performance test by 35 years of age and again by 45 years of age.

**90%**  
of women identified with cervical disease receive treatment (90% of women with precancer treated, and 90% of women with invasive cancer managed).

# Laura Brennan HPV vaccine catch-up programme

- Over **500,000 people** have already received the HPV vaccine through the HSE school vaccination programme.
- Until the end of 2023, the HSE is offering an additional opportunity to join the programme.

Vaccine will be available to:

- females in 2nd to 6th year of secondary school
- females under the age of 25
- males in 2nd to 4th year of secondary school
- males in 5th year







## Laura Brennan HPV vaccine catch-up programme

- Programme is being delivered in phases teams are currently vaccinating those aged 16 and older who are eligible
- Programme is being delivered by HSE School Vaccination Teams and through CVCs
- Eligible people aged 16 and older can book an appointment online
