

<u>Section B: Information Specific to Registered Nurses and Registered Midwives for the</u> administration of the Inactivated Influenza Vaccines (IIV) for the 2025/2026 influenza season

Statutory Instruments No. 245 of 2021 and 511 of 2021 identify health care professionals (including registered nurses and registered midwives) as professions that can administer Inactivated Influenza Vaccine (IIV) to adult vaccine recipients for the 2025/2026 Health Service Executive (HSE) Winter Vaccination Programme.

In order to administer the vaccines, registered nurses and registered midwives must be familiar with the master medicine protocols for the administration of IIV. Registered nurses and registered midwives must also have completed the Self-Assessment of Competency Form included in this section. The medicine protocols and the Self-Assessment of Competency Form are available at www.immunisation.ie

Registered nurses and registered midwives must have attained the professional qualifications, training and competence requirements as listed in Table 1 below in order to be eligible to administer IIV using the HSE master medicine protocols for these vaccines.

TABLE 1 Professional Qualifications, Training, Experience and Competence Required

Professional qualifications, training, experience and competence required prior to using medicine protocols

The registered nurse or registered midwife must have completed all of the following:

- Be a Registered Nurse or Registered Midwife, on the active register maintained by the NMBI
- 2. National Vaccination Education Programme for Registered Nurses/Midwives/Public Health Nurses accessible on: www.HSeLanD.ie
- 3. An approved *Basic Life Support for Health Care Providers Course* within the last two years (i.e. Irish Heart Foundation (IHF))
- 4. Initial National Anaphylaxis Education Programme for Health Care Professionals accessible on: www.HSeLanD.ie followed by a two hour classroom based skills workshop. Recertification is required every two years by completing the on-line National Anaphylaxis Education Programme for Health Care Professionals accessible on: www.HSeLanD.ie
