You/your child were given the following vaccine today:

Reactions that can sometimes happen after getting MMR vaccine include:

- Soreness, swelling and redness where the injection was given
- Fever
- Nasal congestion, runny nose
- Some children/individuals may get “mini measles” with a rash and fever 6 to 10 days after the vaccination. This is not contagious.
- On rare occasions, children/individuals may get “mini-mumps” with swelling of the glands in the neck, cheek, or jaw in the third week after vaccination. This is not contagious.
- Occasionally, the rubella part of the vaccine, may cause a rash, mild joint pain and swollen glands 2 to 4 weeks after the vaccination.

You/your child can take paracetamol or ibuprofen to relieve aches and pains or to lower the fever. If you are concerned about yourself/your child please seek medical advice.

If you require medical advice please contact your GP.

You should avoid pregnancy for one month after MMR vaccination.
