## Background

- National Immunisation Office (NIO) in partnership with the Office of Nursing and Midwifery Services Director (ONMSD), develops the Medicine Protocols for the administration of vaccines under Medicine Protocols by nurse/midwives to children/students Second Level Education through the Schools Immunisation Programme (SIP).
- HSE School Vaccination Teams administer vaccinations under the Medicine Protocols.
- The Centres of Nurse and Midwifery Education (CNME) deliver education to support the School Immunisation Programme (SIP).

### Aim

- The aim of this programme is to facilitate registered nurses/midwives employed by the HSE to develop, maintain and update the requisite knowledge, skills and competencies to safely administer immunisations under Medicine Protocols through the Schools Immunisation Programme (SIP).
- The medicine protocols are developed to deliver the SIP safely and effectively for secondary school children.

# Requirements for Nurses/Midwives to administer Vaccines under Medicine Protocol

#### **Professional Qualifications:**

 Registered nurse and/or registered midwife on the live Register of Nursing and Midwifery Board of Ireland (NMBI).

### Minimum Training, Experience, Competence:

- For registered nurses and/or registered midwives to administer vaccine through the Schools Immunisation Programme (2019/2020) are required to attend at the National Schools Immunisation Education Programme.
- Self assessment of competency is an integral part of the programme which vaccinators must complete to fulfil their competency requirements.
