Concern over vaccine uptakes for the 12 and 13 months visits

Uptake figures for children aged 24 months of age indicate that a number of children are not receiving their third dose of Men C vaccine and Hib booster at 13 months of age.

Children are <u>NOT</u> fully protected against most causes of meningitis after their 6 month injections. <u>TWO</u> more visits at 12 and 13 months of age are needed.

Please highlight this to parents and stress the importance of <u>ALL</u> the vaccines being given at the correct ages.

- If possible give an appointment for the 5th visit at the end of the 4th visit.
- Follow up any defaulters as soon as possible.

Pneumococcal Conjugate Vaccine Guidelines

The HSE has added PCV 13 to its routine programme for all children born on or after 1st October 2010. The Pneumococcal chapter (NIAC Immunisation Guidelines for Ireland) has been updated. The National Cochlear Implant Programme has asked us to remind you that children undergoing cochlear implants are at increased risk of pneumococcal infection. Vaccine Reconstitution

Some vaccines need to be reconstituted such as 6 in 1, Hib, Menjugate and MMR.

This involves transferring the liquid from the syringe into the accompanying vial and drawing the reconstituted vaccine back into the syringe.



Always record the batch number from the box <u>NOT</u> the batch number on the vials

Human Papillomavirus Vaccine

The HPV programme continues for all eligible girls i.e. those in 1st and 2nd year of second level school. These girls have been offered 2 doses of the HPV vaccine. The 3rd dose of vaccine will be offered to all girls taking part in the programme from March 2011.
