



## Immunisation Uptake Rates



The Health Protection Surveillance Centre has published immunisation uptake rates for children aged 24 months (quarter 4, 2010). These figures indicate that a number of children are not receiving their third dose of Men C vaccine and Hib booster vaccine at 13 months of age.

Please highlight the vaccination schedule to parents and stress the importance of **ALL** the vaccines being given at the correct ages.

AGE	WHERE	VACCINATION
At Birth	Hospital or HSE Clinic	BCG
2 Months	GP	6 in 1 + PCV
4 Months	GP	6 in 1 + Men C
6 Months	GP	6 in 1 + PCV + Men C
12 Months	GP	MMR + PCV
13 Months	GP	Men C + Hib

Remember Your child needs 6 GP visits. Bring your child's immunisation passport to each visit.

## Measles Outbreaks in Europe

Many parents and GPs have inquired about administering MMR vaccine to children less than 12 months of age who are travelling to areas where measles outbreaks are occurring in Europe.

The National Immunisation Advisory Committee (NIAC) recommends MMR vaccine at 12 months and 4-5 years of age.

MMR vaccine can be given to children as young as 6 months of age during outbreak situations (although vaccine effectiveness is usually less at this age than when given after 12 months of age).

### **MMR vaccine may take up to 4 weeks to be effective.**

- \* Parents who wish to lessen the risk of measles in their children **between 6- 12 months of age** who may be exposed to measles whilst on holiday in Europe may wish to avail of MMR vaccine. This dose would **not be counted as a valid dose from the point of the vaccination programme and should be repeated at 12 months of age, at least one month after the first vaccine with a further dose at 4 - 5 years of age.**
- \* Parents who wish to lessen the risk of measles in their children **between 1 – 5 years of age** who may be exposed to measles whilst on holiday in Europe may wish to avail of a second dose of MMR vaccine. This dose would usually be counted as a valid dose from the point of the vaccination programme and no further MMR vaccine is required.
- \* The MMR vaccine is provided free via the HSE National Cold Chain Service but parents should pay for the vaccine administration.

**Note: If a child under 18 months of age receives a second MMR vaccine within three months of the first MMR, a third MMR vaccine should be given at 4 - 5 years of age.**

## Send Back your Vaccine Returns

All unused Pandemrix (H1N1) and seasonal flu vaccines will be collected by our Cold Chain drivers on your next scheduled monthly delivery date (even if you have not ordered any vaccines).

If you are unsure of this date you can contact the Customer Service team at 01 463 7770

Please have unused vaccines ready for collection place these vaccines and any other expired vaccines in a box with a completed Returns form (available from Customer Service or on [www.immunisation.ie](http://www.immunisation.ie) under "Vaccine Ordering and Storage").

Vaccines for return do NOT need to be kept in the fridge.

To date only 40% of sites have returned unused flu vaccines.



## Flu Vaccine

We have been receiving a number of calls from GP practices requesting flu vaccine for patients.

The flu season (2010/2011) ended in April 2011. Flu vaccine cannot be ordered for patients.

We will be in contact with practices prior to the next flu season to outline vaccine availability, delivery schedule, risk groups etc and will supply informational materials.
