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The new HSE National Cold Chain Delivery Service managed by United Drug Distributors (UDD) commenced on January 1st 2007 and provides vaccines on a monthly basis.

As before orders can be placed by phone, fax or email and the Customer Services Team will phone one week in advance of delivery to take an order, confirm a received order or confirm no order is required.

One of the new features of the service is the sending of an automated email or fax from UDD to confirm orders.

Not too late for Flu and Pneumococcal Vaccination

Although influenza activity was at low levels in Ireland up to the end of January, vaccination should still be offered in the early months of 2007.

Supplies of flu and pneumococcal vaccine are still available for those at risk who have not yet received it



Guidance for Tetanus Vaccination

The National Immunisation Advisory Committee (NIAC) recently issued guidance on tetanus vaccination for unimmunised adults and children 10 years and over.

- Unless there is a reliable vaccine history, individuals should be assumed to be unimmunised, and a full course of immunisation administered.
- In such situations give dT (diTe booster) as the primary series vaccine (three doses) followed by an additional two booster doses.

Updated recommendations for pneumococcal vaccination

The National Immunisation Advisory Committee (NIAC) recently updated recommendations for pneumococcal vaccination.

Individuals at increased risk, regardless of age, should be vaccinated with the appropriate pneumococcal vaccine(s) for their age group.

- All at risk children up to the age of 5 years (<60 months) should receive pneumococcal conjugate vaccine (Prevenar)
- At risk children between the ages of 2-5 years (24-59 Months) should also receive a single dose of 23-valent polysaccharide vaccine (Pneumovax II) at least two months after the final dose of conjugate vaccine.
- At risk children over the age of 5 years (60 months and older) and adults should receive a single dose of pneumococcal polysaccharide vaccine. (Pneumovax II)
