#### Head of Service Update

Welcome to the Winter 2024 edition of the National Forensic Mental Health Service newsletter. This bumper edition highlights a lot of activity over the past number of months and it also includes information on some of the activities scheduled for the holiday period in December 2024. Many thanks to Simon and all the contributors for collating this information together so as to keep us all informed of life events in the NFMHS.

On reflection, this year, 2024 appears to have passed very quickly and that maybe due to the high level of activity and busyness we have all experienced over the past 12 months. It is very evident across the service that we are settling into Portrane after two years. Routines and practices are becoming normalised and many challenges encountered at the early part of our tenure in Portrane are being addressed or resolved. It is only through proactive engagement and communication across the service that we will continue to improve and build on what we are achieving.

You will see reference to the town hall meetings in this newsletter (virtual and actual) in recent months. This has been a great opportunity to update staff on what is occurring across the service and also to hear the views of staff on their experiences and suggestions on what is possible. This office is in the process of scheduling these sessions again for 2025 as this was one of the key messages during the town hall meetings held so far. The service has also held two Cluster meetings which have been very helpful in gaining understanding on specific challenges and I would like to thank Dr Mullaney and Dr Monks and their multidisciplinary teams for facilitating these engagements.

I continue to receive letters from patients and the focus of these letters has substantially changed over the past 12 months. While some letters are requesting assistance on specific matters and others are letters of complaints, we receive complements to staff and the service, and suggestions on areas of improvements are now informing my weekly reading list. This is great to see and very welcome.

There are plans in place for 2025 to open all of the remaining bed places in the Central Mental Hospital. We have received approval to employ staff to open these places in the CMH. We have submitted a business case to increase our staffing into the Prisons to address the need to support our Prison In reach teams to meet the demands on them to treat and divert people in prison.

We have also experienced loss this year with the bereavement of some of our work colleagues and former patients of the service. These have been very difficult times for us as the loss of those we work with and care for leaves a void filled with sadness and grief. Our thoughts and prayers go to family and friends of those who have died this year, especially facing into this holiday season.

Finally, on behalf of the Area Management Team, we would like to thank you all for your hard work and dedication to the care and treatment of the patients in the NFMHS this year. Without your commitment to the service, we would not be able to meet the ongoing challenges experienced yet achieve the level of care and treatment required for our patients.

As we move into December 2024, holiday greeting to you, your families and friends and we hope you have a safe, healthy and enjoyable holiday period.


Leave arrangements are being finalised for the holiday period.


## **Occupational Therapy**


