3	There are 3 main COVID-19 vaccines in Ireland:
Pfizer	1. COVID-19 vaccine Pfizer – also called Comirnaty
VidPrevtyn Beta	2. COVID-19 vaccine VidPrevtyn Beta
NOVAVAX	3. COVID-19 vaccine Novavax - also called Nuvaxovid.


AstraZeneca AstraZeneca	In Ireland, the COVID-19 vaccines called AstraZeneca, Janssen, and Moderna are not used anymore. You can find information about these vaccines on the HSE website.
easy read	There is an Easy to Read information leaflet on each of the main COVID-19 vaccines. These are on the HSE website.
	These information leaflets will tell you about the vaccine.
	The leaflets will tell you who should not get the vaccine.


	The leaflets tell you what to expect after your vaccine and list the possible side effects.
	It is your choice to get the vaccine or not.
HE	The HSE only uses vaccines that meet safety standards. All the COVID-19 vaccines have had safety checks.
	In Ireland, the National Immunisation Advisory Committee gives advice on vaccines to the Department of Health. The HSE puts this advice into action.






What do we mean when we talk about vaccines?









Recommended COVID-19 vaccines for your age group

All COVID-19 vaccines give you good protection from serious illness with COVID-19.
 The vaccines give you good protection when you have: your first round of vaccines and any extra or booster doses you need.
You will be offered a vaccine that suits your age.

	If you are aged 5 and over, you will be offered the Pfizer vaccine for COVID-19.
	The Pfizer COVID-19 vaccine is an mRNA vaccine. You can find out more at www.hse.ie.
	Some people cannot have an mRNA vaccine.
NOVAVAX	lf you cannot have an mRNA vaccine, you may be offered a Novavax vaccine.



Sometimes, you might be offered the VidPrevtyn Beta vaccine.




Novavax is for people aged 12 and over.

VidPrevtyn Beta is a booster vaccine for people aged 18.




The National Immunisation Advisory Committee said you can get a COVID-19 mRNA vaccine as a booster dose.

You can do this even if you had a different vaccine before.



There are mRNA vaccines which have been changed to be given as booster doses.



These booster vaccines protect you better against different types of COVID-19 called variants.



One of these changed vaccines can be given as a booster or as your first vaccine.



You should get a COVID-19 vaccine if you are pregnant, trying for a baby, might get pregnant, or breastfeeding.





Most pregnant people that get the virus do not get very ill. They give birth as planned and the risk of

passing COVID-19 to their baby is low.


However, if you are pregnant, there is more chance you could get a serious illness and need treatment in hospital.




