## What to expect after your Moderna COVID-19 vaccine

	Like all medicines, vaccines can cause side effects. There are different side effects for different COVID-19 vaccines.
	Most of these will not make you very sick and will not last too long.
	Not everyone gets side effects after a vaccine.
moderna	In this leaflet, we will tell you about the side effects of the Moderna COVID-19 vaccine. We will tell you who should not get this vaccine.

### Who should not get the Moderna COVID-19 vaccine?

	You will only be given the Moderna COVID-19 vaccine if you are over 30 years of age.
Covue cove covincial Coronavin Vaccine	You should not get the Moderna COVID-19 vaccine if you have had a bad reaction to any of the ingredients. This includes an ingredient called polyethylene glycol. You can find out about the ingredients here: www.hse.ie/covid19VaccinePIL
	You should not get the Moderna COVID-19 vaccine if you have been told by your doctor that you should not have this vaccine or the Pfizer COVID-19 vaccine.


You should not get the Moderna COVID-19 vaccine if you had a bad reaction to the first dose of this COVID-19 vaccine or the Pfizer COVID-19 vaccine.
You should not get the Moderna COVID-19 vaccine if you have had a severe allergic reaction after Trometamol. This is an ingredient in dye used in MRI tests.
Talk to your doctor before getting this vaccine if you had a bad reaction to any vaccine or medication before.
Talk to your doctor before getting this vaccine if you had an illness called Capillary Leak Syndrome before.

	Talk to your Doctor if you had myocarditis or pericarditis after a COVID-19 vaccine before.


# What are the side effects of the Moderna COVID-19 vaccine?



Some people get side effects from the COVID-19 vaccine.



	<ul> <li>Some people get other side effects.</li> <li>These do not happen often.</li> <li>Rarely people may have: <ul> <li>weakness in the muscles on one side of your face</li> <li>tingling or prickling sensation, or loss of sensation in some part of the body</li> <li>swelling in your face. This can happen to people who have had injections, called cosmetic fillers, on their face.</li> </ul> </li> </ul>



Extremely rarely, a person may have a skin reaction that causes red spots or patches. This looks like a bulls-eye. Extremely rarely, a person may get bad swelling in their arm or leg where the vaccine was given.
Very rarely, a person may get a problem with their heart or lining of their heart after getting the Moderna COVID-19 vaccine. This is called Myocarditis or Pericarditis. Myocarditis and pericarditis are more common in men under the age of 30. They are more common after the second primary vaccine dose. The risk of these side effects appears to be lower after the first booster. The symptoms of myocarditis and pericarditis are: • being out of breath • fast heartbeat • chest pain. Contact your doctor straight away if you have any of these symptoms.
