TEST ITEM DELIVERY AND REPORTING ACCORDING TO TIMEFRAMES AND DEADLINES POLICY

1 Introduction

This SOP details the protocol to be adopted for the following:

- 1.1 The delivery of samples to the laboratory.
- 1.2 The timely reporting of samples.

2 Responsibility

It is the responsibility of all members of staff that samples are managed according to this SOP.

3 Procedure

- 3.1 The protocol for the delivery of samples to the laboratory is addressed for each laboratory customer in any Service Level Agreement. It is a requirement of the Public Analyst's Laboratory, Dublin that all customers submitting clinical samples undertake to deliver the patient samples in accordance with the International Carriage of Dangerous Goods by Road (ADR) Regulations (or any such regulations that may be effected from time to time) for transport of biological samples by road or rail and in accordance with any special criteria required.
- 3.2 Analyse samples and issue analytical reports to customers as soon as possible after sample receipt.
- 3.3 Apply maximum deadlines as detailed in Table 1 unless otherwise agreed with the customer. Timeframes are based on Received Date unless timeframes are specified in legislation. Samples from 'new' customers (e.g. FSA NI/ An Garda Síochana) will be logged using the current sample reference type (e.g. CLF) appropriate to that sample type and the deadlines detailed in Table 1 for that reference type will apply.

Note: Two weeks for the Christmas period and one week for the Easter period can be added to the Due Date, if the Due Date falls ordinarily in either of these holiday periods except where timeframes are specified by legislation. Where the due date falls between the 23rd December and the 1st of January (or the 2nd or 3rd of January where the 1st of January falls on a Saturday or Sunday) 10 working days may be added to the Due Date except where timeframes are specified by legislation. In respect of Easter, 5 working days may be added to the Due Date except where timeframes are specified by legislation when the Due Date falls on or between Good Friday and Easter Monday.

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- Prior to sending a sample(s) to a subcontracting laboratory, agree a timeframe for analysis, taking into account the deadlines as detailed in Table 1.
- 3.5 In order to facilitate meeting the deadlines, at least two analysts should be trained in the analysis of each high priority parameter (with competency maintained). Ideally this competency should be available in the Section where analysis is normally performed as the analysts will be familiar with the working environment and in working with the other team members.
- 3.6 Agree any sample reporting timeframes outside of the above in writing with the customer. This may apply to customer led timeframes, such as pertaining to FSAI-provided survey samples.
- 3.7 For follow-up/repeat samples it was agreed that SOP PALA 0019 Analysis according to Public Health Risk-based Prioritisation will govern the timeframe given for reporting; 4 weeks deadline for contaminants; 6 weeks for other sample types.
- 3.8 In the event that the Flexible Scope is employed an extended deadline may be agreed with the customer to facilitate the completion of required validation in accordance with SOP PALA SOP PALA 0030 Operation of the Laboratory Flexible Scope.
- 3.9 When a report is updated with further information received from an NRL, this may be regarded as an 'other official activity' as per Article 2(2) or Regulation (EC) 625/2017. This result will also, most likely be accredited under 15189. In the event that work needs to be subcontracted as a result of the outcome of testing (example: dispatch of bacterial isolates to an NRL for further investigation), then, when that report contains results of interest to the customer or competent authority, an updated report will be issued as soon as possible after the receipt of a report from the NRL. The laboratory cannot anticipate when it will receive such additional information. The content of such a report cannot always be anticipated and a LIMS analysis update may be required prior to the issue of an updated report to enable such reporting.
