



Roles and Responsibilities of HSE Contracted Services

HSE contracted services need to be aware of and comply with their responsibilities under the [Children First Act 2015](#) and [Children First National Guidance for the Protection and Welfare of Children 2017](#).

All organisations, including those providing services to adults, should consider the need to have policies and procedures in place on the following:

- ◆ Dealing with child protection concerns
- ◆ Reporting child protection concerns
- ◆ Working safely with children
- ◆ Recruiting and managing staff
- ◆ Involving parents and children
- ◆ Implementing and reviewing safeguarding strategies

Many people in contracted services are [Mandated Persons](#) and have a legal responsibility to report child protection concerns above a defined threshold to Tusla - Child and Family Agency. To find out which professionals are mandated persons check [Schedule 2 of the Children First Act 2015](#).

Legal Responsibilities of Relevant Services

Organisations classed as providers of **'relevant services'** under the Children First Act have statutory obligations to:

- Keep children safe from harm while availing of those services;
- Carry out a risk assessment; and
- Prepare and publish a Child Safeguarding Statement.

Chapter 4 in [Children First National Guidance for the Protection and Welfare of Children 2017](#) outlines statutory obligations and best practice procedures in child safeguarding that all organisations dealing with children and young people should consider.
