- 4. Adult Mental Health Services/Addiction Services
- 5. The Rehabilitation & Recovery Team

Acute Services

Services are provided in partnership with clients, their families, carers, statutory and non-statutory voluntary groups and also locally based community groups with the aim of achieving the best quality of life for each individual through the provision of seamless, high quality person-centred services. Acute care is currently provided in temporary accommodation in a new nursing home until such time as the purpose built Acute Unit is completed on the existing vacated site attached to Letterkenny General Hospital.

Community Services

A full range of Community Services provides a comprehensive range of integrated care in partnership with Primary Health Services to clients and their families which include Community Mental Health Multi-Disciplinary Teams consisting of a broad range of disciplines e.g. Social Workers, Occupational Therapists, Psychologists, Youth Addiction Counsellor, Clinical Nurse Specialists, Consultant Psychiatrists, Community Mental Health Nurses.

Referral to Community Services should be processed via General Practioner/ Primary Health Care Team.

- Plans for the establishment of an Eating Disorder Service for Donegal.

• Introduction of a Management Information System in Mental Health which is being developed as a national pilot (WISDOM).
